# Looking Back, Looking Ahead

Greeting St. Mark's Family,

Here is a look at how we did in 2018, with some thoughts as we move into 2019.

For the second consecutive year, we paid our apportionments (our shared connectional giving) in full. We can be proud of how we've supported the United Methodist Church. We also made good progress on paying down the loan taken out a few years ago for improvements around the church. We reduced the principal balance by \$10,000 and now owe \$69,000.

The total giving and receipts was \$304,000 for the year. This was a 10% decline from 2017. Despite the decline in giving, we paid all our bills and paid them on time! Our total expenses were \$334,000, and were down about 3% from the prior year. The biggest reason for the lower expenses was the open jobs that we had throughout the year.

As a reminder, we borrowed \$15,000 in April of 2018 to replace our computer systems as they were failing. We've been making payments every month and now owe about \$11,500.

The parking lot fund sits at \$7,645. We need \$9,000 to repair the sinkhole, but are hoping to get to \$22,000 to repave the entire lot – an if we can get to \$35,000 we can also upgrade the parking lot lighting. Please consider a one-time gift to this fund to improve the safety of our facility.

We ended the year with about \$39,500 on deposit at the credit union of which \$31,800 is in designated funds (which means they cannot be used for the general operating expenses, such as salaries, utilities, etc. of the church). Unfortunately, St. Mark's has little to no cushion for our church finances and this is a growing concern. As we look forward to 2019, your church leadership would ask that you consider your giving and how you might continue to grow in your stewardship.

Recently, the Administrative Council has approved the 2019 budget for St. Mark's. The total expenses in the budget are \$373,000. The biggest changes from last year to this year are that we expect to be fully staffed this year. Salaries and benefits make up almost one-half of all our expenses. We have also added money to increase ministries and outreach for the year as well as dollars to replace broken air conditioners in the classrooms and replace some of the hallway lightening. To reach this level of spending, St. Mark's will need to see an increase in the dollars received.

There are positive signs for 2019. We received about 75 pledge cards for the year with total commitments of \$252,479.36. This was the most pledge cards turned in during the past few years and reflects the positive feelings many of us have about the direction of St. Mark's. We've also seen an increase in the number of families using electronic giving. This helps St. Mark's by allowing giving to be more predictable. And most recently, we also had a very strong response to the love offering for Pastor Joe's Christmas gift – probably double what it was the last few years. So there's positive momentum in a number of financial areas.

### Nurture, Outreach and Witness

Outreach- Julie and Karen shared their 2018 report: 146 members participated in an outreach, many serving more than one time. Under consideration for 2019 includes a fall mission trip to the Midwest Distribution Center and a church-wide campaign to support the Heifer Project.

Nurture- Currently their projects include pairing our college students with a member for care and support, serving funeral meals, and visitation and communion to our homebound members (this is coordinated by Lois Hill).

Witness & Outreach- Plans for 2019 include an Easter event which will be open to the community and two summer "at the movies" events that will tie-in with the subsequent Sunday service and message.

### Children and Family Ministry

Peggy reported that her main goal for January is to start building a "KidMin" team, a group with a passion for kids to help dream and plan for our children. We will partner with the Scouts who meet here to collect shoes for the Soles4Soles mission. Scout Sunday will be celebrated on Feb. 10<sup>th</sup>. Peggy has been looking through the VBS materials that we have from our grant money and will start planning summer VBS when a KidMin team is established. The re-emergence of Children's Moments has been very well received.

### Other Reports

Lay Leader – Sue reminded us about the Jan. 17<sup>th</sup> "Way Forward" event with Bishop Palmer and the Jan. 26<sup>th</sup> leadership training day offered to all on this committee.

Staff Parish – Erin shared that two interviews were conducted for the youth leader position. Unfortunately, neither was a good fit and they are considering more resumes that have been submitted.

Trustees – Ray reported that the parking lot campaign stands at \$7,644.

Finance – See Report elsewhere in this Newsletter.

Joe shared a letter and agenda from Tony for this Saturday's meeting which will be from 9-3. All members of the Task Force and Administrative Council are invited and urged to attend.

# Task Force Update St. Mark's UMC

I just wanted to take a few moments to update everyone on the latest work of the St. Mark's Task Force. As mentioned in the December service update, the Task Force (TF) has held several joint meetings with the Administrative Council (AC) with Tony Mosely serving as facilitator. We've reviewed and discussed his recommendations found in the report he submitted. Jointly, the TF and AC have prioritized and strategized on each recommendation during a 3 hour joint session in December.

On January 12<sup>th</sup>, the TF and AC met with Tony for a retreat meeting at St. Mark's from 9 am to 2 pm to discuss recommendation #1 from Tony's report as it relates to developing a set of core values and vision and how it relates to the Mission statement of the United Methodist Church. With Tony's guidance, the TF and AC worked through the process of developing a vision statement along with a set of core values to be created and shared in the coming weeks. The session was based in scripture combining the report (spanning the nearly 90 interviews members/non-members) submitted by Tony, Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations by Robert Schnase, and the Statement of Understanding with the District. Much of the work and brainstorming notes can be found/reviewed on the walls of fellowship hall. The Joint session will yield a formally submitted vision statement along with core values for St. Mark's to move forward in unity and service to Christ. This set of core values and vision statement will be shared with the congregation within the coming weeks.

The Task Force and Administrative Council will meet again on Monday, February 11<sup>th</sup> to begin work on other recommendations found in Tony's report. These recommendations can be found in the "Conclusions" section of Tony's report on pages 16 and 17.

### **Mission Spotlight**

The Broken Bus Ministry is a grass-roots mission that was started by a Liberty Township family in 2013. Many of us know and love them- Michelle and Greg Bailes and their children, Jordan and Justin. What started out as serving pizza out of the trunk of their car to the homeless in downtown Cincinnati, the dream and the call from God eventually led them to buy a broken down, rusty, beat-up bus, THE Broken Bus. About three years ago, the ministry was able to move its operations from the Bailes garage to a storage facility in Fairfield where donations are accepted, sorted and the bus is prepared for its weekly trip. Five years later, the mission thrives and serves weekly; feeding, clothing and building relationships with the homeless in our city.

One of Michele's most important goals is to plant seeds of servant ministry among the community. Volunteers of all ages and from all parts of the Cincinnati area have served in various ways including families, church groups, Scouts, school groups, high school sports teams, the list goes on and on. So how did St. Marks start our partnership with the Broken Bus? Glad you asked! It's all because of Ann McWilliam! About three years ago, she brought a newspaper clipping to our Ruth Circle meeting. The article talked about this emerging ministry and their need for support. Ruth Circle decided to send a donation and the rest is history. We asked Michele to bring the bus to St. Marks and tell her story to the youth, later she spoke to the whole congregation. Her personal story and her genuine love for those who are mostly unloved and cast aside spoke to many of us and we knew we had to get involved.

St. Marks supports The Broken Bus Ministry with our gifts, prayers and our talents. St. Marks Cares, through your generous designated giving, sends regular donations. Our Ruth Circle group often supports them as well. St. Marks has a small group of dedicated, hard working women who volunteer most Wednesday mornings at "the bus stop" (our name for the storage facility) sorting donations and loading the bus for its Saturday trip downtown. We've sent many of our members on bus rides, cooked delicious, hearty meals to be served to the homeless and we regularly have donation drives to help stock the bus.

2018 Mission/Outreach Results

Thank you church for your commitment to mission and outreach. During 2018, mission/outreach opportunities were available for 6 organizations on a regular basis, 2 mission trips and various outlets during Good Neighbor Sunday. 146+ people volunteered for at least one of those, 39 people volunteered for 2 or more and several people served multiple times for a specific organization.

<u>Financial and/or gifts in kind support in the amount of \$14,513</u> was provided for 2 missionary families, UMCOR and 10 organizations (the regular 8 plus Parkside Nursing Home and Big Creek Missions). Check out the detailed results posted on the bulletin board for more information.
