Dear St. Mark's Family, (the following was also shared during worship on June 2)

I look forward to being with you again beginning June 2. Thank you for the opportunity to have this much needed time away. I needed it.

Yesterday (June 1), Linda and I received the autopsy report and death certificate from Iowa. These documents confirmed that Jonathan chose to end his life by suicide, a cause that first came to us as a possibility just a few days following the memorial service. This magnifies the trauma and time of recovery ("recovery" is not the best word). It's tragic to lose a son suddenly as we did. But, suicide brings more. It brings questions, guilt, regret, some anger. There is a certain stigma around the topic of suicide. We don't like to talk about it. Sometimes there's embarrassment and shame. But, we need to talk about it.

Here in the U.S., people are afraid. People are afraid of illegal immigrants crossing our borders, and possibly doing harm to us. We fear those who would attack us. Some are afraid of walking the streets at night.

But, the fact is that more people kill themselves than are killed by others. Let that sink in.

In the last 20 years, suicides have increased by 30%.

In 2017, 47,173 Americans died by suicide.

In 2017, there were an estimated 1,400,000 suicide attempts.

Suicide is the 10th leading cause of death.

Suicide is the second leading cause of death for people 10 to 34 years of age. (a, b, c, d, e source: American Federation of Suicide Prevention).

This is a crisis. Before Jonathan's death, I did not know of these startling statistics. I had no idea.

The Payne family continues to process and come to terms with our loss. I know also that others experience similar losses, and that given these statistics, it is possible that most of us have been impacted by suicide in some way. My prayers go to all who are in pain, to all who suffer.

From here on, I will work to find ways, big and small, to help others in their pain. We will work together to find ways to decrease the number of these tragic deaths. We will be advocates of healing — healing of body, mind, and spirit.

As our choir sang on June 2,

When the sun beats down on the barren ground, and turns the soil to stone; When the rain falls hard, and the rivers flood, and the banks won't hold.

You are my Shelter, You are my Hideaway, You are my Covering, You keep me safe. You are my Harbor, You are my Quiet Place, You are my Refuge, and my Strength;

You are my Shelter.

Attitudes Toward Difference Surveys

Thank you to the 87 who completed the "Attitudes Toward Difference" surveys. The last day to receive the surveys was on Easter, April 21. A draft report on the surveys will be shared with the Administrative Council during a meeting at 7 pm on June 25th. Afterwards, the congregation will receive the report and our steps forward from there.

St. Mark's Finance Report

Greeting St. Mark's Family,

Here's your April finance report and a preview of our May results.

In April, we received \$26,500 into St. Mark's. At first glance, this compares negatively to both March 2019 and April 2018, but both of those had 5 Sundays. The weekly average in April was up about \$1,000 from the prior month and same month last year. Year to date we are up about 8% in total giving/receipts. We spent \$25,500 for the month so we squeezed out a \$1,000 profit. No major spending was completed for the month. We paid another month of apportionments to both the district and the conference. We also made our loan payments on time and our total debt now sits at just under \$77,000. Despite this positive news, we are behind our budget by about \$10,000 in total giving for the year. We are fortunate that we have spent about \$12,000 less than our budget this year – mainly due to not having to spend much on capital expenditures.

Another key item is that the parking lot fund now sits at just over \$12,000 – which is enough to repair the sinkhole. We remain hopeful to get to \$35,000 to considerably improve the safety of our facility to include sinkhole repair, parking lot re-pavement and additional lightening in the parking. A special thanks for the folks who organized the salad luncheon which contributed about \$2,000 to the fund. Please consider contributing to this important effort.

It's too early for May results to be in, but they are in line with each prior month. Giving remains fairly constant and fortunately there were no major expenses for the month. We do expect our expenses for the month to be higher than the amount we bring in further complicating our tight cash position.

The Finance Committee remains concerned is that our cash position is weak. At the end of each month, we are actually a bit short on money. This means we essentially borrow from ourselves to pay all the bills. In other words, if we do not have enough cash to pay out all the designated funds. At the end of April, this so-called borrowing was \$4,000. We generally make it up after the next Sunday, but it's a delicate balancing act and one we hope to get ahead of soon.

MISSION SPOTLIGHT- BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS

The first Big Brothers Big Sisters agency was founded in Cincinnati in 1903! Big Brothers Big Sisters of Butler County has provided mentors to children since 1968 and is the only evidence-based mentoring agency in Butler County. Our mission is to provide children facing adversity with strong and enduring, professionally-supported, one-to-one relationships that change their lives for the better, forever! We serve approximately 700 children each year.

Some of the risk factors our children demonstrate include:

90% live at or below the poverty line;

48% are from single female headed households;

18% reside with non-parental guardians;

19% are the child of an incarcerated parent;

71% have a family history of substance abuse;

10% have a mental health diagnosis;

More than 50% have a history of child abuse in their families of origin.



The mentors spend time with their Little Brother or Sister two to four times per month working on goals established for each individual child, having fun and building a friendship. It's this friendship that makes the impact of mentoring possible. The mentor serves as a positive role model for the child, demonstrating in the way he/she lives her life, that if the child stays in school and works hard, life can be different than the one the child is experiencing now.

Of the Butler County children we served in 2018,

95% improved their level of self-confidence;

77% demonstrated a sense of the future;

81% improved their academic performance;

90% improved their attitude toward school;

88% were able to avoid juvenile delinquency;

84% were able to avoid substance abuse;

84% were able to avoid early parenting;

93% improved their relationship with peers;

86% improved their relationship with adults.

There are currently 173 Butler County children waiting for a Big Brother or Sister. St. Mark's congregation can support the mission of Big Brothers Big Sisters by making a donation to help fund the cost of finding, screening, training, matching and supervising new volun-

teer mentors for some of the children on the waiting list or you can become a mentor!



I've worked in the not-for-profit sector all my life. When my family moved to Fairfield 18 years ago, I wanted to work for a not-for-profit that served children. I was fortune to find a job with Big Brothers Big Sisters of Butler County and have worked there ever since. I have witnessed the impact that mentoring can have on a child's life and it is truly life-changing. I invite you to help defend the potential of local children through the gift of your time, your talent or your treasures!


