

A Note from Pastor Joe



Dear St. Mark's Church Family,

Halloween, a day enjoyed by many, has come and gone. It's a fun day. But, did you know about the day after Halloween, or more properly, All Hallows' (Saints') Eve? It's all Saints Day. United Methodists observe the day on the first Sunday after November 1. This year the day falls on November 3. As is our custom, we will be honoring all saints, living and dead, particularly those who have

passed away the previous 12 months.

Why do we do this? I thought you might be interested in reading an excerpt from an article I read on umc.org:

John Wesley called All Saints Day "a festival I truly love." So...United Methodists believe in saints? Well, yes and no. Wesley cautioned against holding saints in too high regard. However, he also advised against disregarding the saints altogether.

All Saints Day is an opportunity to give thanks for all those who have gone before us in the faith. It is a time to celebrate our history, what United Methodists call the tradition of the church. From the early days of Christianity, there is a sense that the Church consists of not only all living believers, but also all who have gone before us. For example, in Hebrews 12 the author encourages Christians to remember that a "great cloud of witnesses" surrounds us encouraging us, cheering us on.

Alongside the likes of Paul from the New Testament, Augustine, Martin Luther, and John and Charles Wesley, we tell stories of the grandmother who took us to church every Sunday. We remember the pastor who prayed with us in the hospital, and the neighbor who changed the oil in the family car. We give thanks for the youth leader who told us Jesus loved us, the kindergarten Sunday school teacher who showered us with that love, and the woman in the church who bought us groceries when we were out of work.

Retelling these stories grounds us in our history. These memories teach us how God has provided for us through the generosity and sacrifice of those who have come before us. The stories of the saints encourage us to be all God has created us to be. We think of the inspirational people with whom we worship on Sunday, and those across the world we will never meet. We celebrate fellow United Methodists who inspire us, and those of other denominations whose lives encourage us. We give thanks for those with whom we agree, as well as those whose views we do not share.

Additionally, we remember and pray for our sisters and brothers in Christ who faithfully follow Jesus in places where being labeled a Christian puts them in harm's way.

On All Saints Day, let us give thanks for both the saints in glory and those on earth, who have led us to Jesus. As they have shared the gospel with us, may we add our voices so someone else may hear about the grace and love of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Join us November 3 as we give thanks "For all the saints, who from their labors rest."

St. Mark's Financial Update

Greetings, St. Mark's Family:

Our financial results for September were pretty similar to the story I've been telling all year. Giving was up from last year's same time. Expenses were up too. And we remain tight in our cash position.

We received just over \$30,000 for the month compared with expenses of \$25,500 – meaning we brought in \$4,500 more than we spent. This is the first month in quite a while where giving outpaced what we spent. We were fortunate that spending was down a bit from our average as we typically spend about \$28,000 each month.

In other important news, we paid our loans on time and the outstanding balances are just under \$72,000. And we have paid 9/12 of our annual district and conference apportionments. We've already paid October's installment, so we only have two more months to go to make 100% apportionment payments for the third year in a row! Thank you for your faithfulness in giving.

The committees of the church have been busy planning for 2020. They've submitted their budgets based on their hopes and dreams for St. Mark's. A key part of the budget process is Consecration Sunday, which will be November 24th. Pastor Joe has a wonderful series based on the classic movie, "It's a Wonderful Life". Be sure not to miss it.

Thanks to all who donated coats and sweatshirts for our annual Coat Drive in October and thanks to the seven individuals who volunteered at Matthew 25 Ministries on October 19th.

Upcoming Opportunities to Serve:

We are collecting monetary donations until November 10th as our <u>**Thanksgiving "Giving Project**</u>." The money will be given to the Fairfield Food Pantry to help provide a Thanksgiving meal to families in need. Each family will be given a turkey and all the good sides to go with it! The estimated cost for this meal is \$25

for a family of four or less and \$30 for a family of five or more. If you'd like to contribute, please do so through the offering plate. Write "Fairfield Food Pantry" on the memo line of your check or on the outside of your offering envelope. We have set a goal of \$500 which will help feed at least 20 families. 
As we neared the end of the summer, Pastor Joe invited us to his house to gather and work on a back-to-school craft for the children of our congregation.
