SUNDAY, April 5th, 5—7 pm.



St. Mark's Ad. Council Meeting February 11, 2020

Members present: Pastor Joe Payne, Steve Nguyen, Pam Guynes, Charlotte Tierney, ErinTheodor, Peggy Smith, Pat Fassnacht, Bob Hamp, Kym Nguyen and Sue Luken.

I. Call to order. The meeting was called to order by Steve Nguyen at 7pm.

II. Review Minutes from Jan. meeting: The minutes were reviewed, no corrections were found. The motion to accept the Jan. minutes was made by Erin Theodor, 2nd by Kym Nguyen. The vote minutes were approved as read.

III. Monthly Committee Reports: The Committee Reports had been distributed by email for everyone to read previous to the meeting. Discussion was open for any comments or questions on each report. Erin shared on the upcoming "Parents Night Out" that she had received a message from one of the Boy Scout parents an interest in bringing their child and possibly a friend. She also commented that this activity is one she would like to begin having every other month.

There was no other discussion on any of the reports. A motion to approve all of the reports as presented was made by Kym Nguyen, 2nd by Bob Hamp. The motion was approved.

IV. Review Finance Report/Updates: Steve Nouven opened up discussion about Apportionments by explaining how they had been dealt with in the past under different leadership, not as a criticism but just to have some conversation and get some feedback. He had brought to our attention that at times the Finance Committee had looked at our over-all financial health and at times had chosen to not fully pay the Apportionments until we were able to better fulfill our budgetary needs. There was some healthy discussion on this topic, with a variety of people sharing their input and opinions. Pastor Joe shared that he appreciated Steve's concern. He also explained that the apportionments are, in fact, a portion of our whole budget, and if we are to remain United Methodists we are ethically obligated to pay our fair share. Our apportionments represent our fair share in the whole connectional giving of our district, conference, and denomination. Pastor Joe also shared some history, that St. Mark's would have never been established in 1953 had it not been for the full support coming from other churches' connectional giving (apportionments). Both Pastor Joe and Steve stated their appreciation to be able to have this open and honest conversation. The report was approved.

V. Pastor's Report: Pastor Joe shared about some of his work with the parish, including conducting 5 worship services including Epiphany, Baptismal Renewal, and Scout Sunday; shared appreciated for Patrick from "The Fringe Coffee House" as well and how he was extremely well received. He reported that he has made more than 47 Pastoral Touch Point calls since the beginning of the year by means of; phone calls, cards, texts, emails, and personal visits. He also reported that we have had 7 deaths since our All Saints Day Service, and thanked the Care and Nurture Committee for their funeral meal ministry.

Pastor Joe made us aware of the following upcoming dates and activities:

- April 9 Maundy Thursday;
- April 12 Easter

Pastor Joe shared that the "Healthy Congregation Workshop" for all of the leaders will take place after worship beginning on March 1 from 11-12:30 (Sessions 1 & 2 combined) and then March 8, 15, & 22 from 11-12pm (for Sessions 3, 4, & 5. One session each week.) [Update: only the March 1 date will be held. The other Sundays will be reserved for a New Member Class.]

VI. General Conference Updates: Pastor Joe shared that the Protocol was written into legislative format and submitted to three – four different annual conferences for their consideration and possible forwarding to General Conference in May for consideration. Pastor Joe plans to attend at least part of the General Conference which happens May 5-15, 2020 in Minneapolis.

VII. Capital Campaign Discussions: Pastor Joe led a discussion on timing for the campaign, including the possibility of holding off until after General Conference, or possibly even in the fall. No specific date was set. It was also suggested by Kym Nguyen that we could still be thinking and maybe even approaching some people who we feel would have the gifts, talents and abilities to be on a "Campaign Committee." These persons could be in place when the time comes.

Steve Nguyen asked if we have ever considered an "Endowment Fund." The consensus was that this would be worthy for further discussion and research.

VIII. Closing prayer - As our meeting time came to an end, Pastor Joe closed us with prayer.

IX. Adjourned Meeting was adjourned.

St. Mark's Financial Update

Greetings St. Mark's Family,



Total giving and receipts for January were nearly \$31,000. The giving was helped by in part by a few of our households who gave their entire 2020 pledge in January. Our expenses for the month were \$31,500. So we ended up spending about \$500 more than we brought in for the month. On a positive note, the giving was up about \$3,000 from January of 2019.

We have completed our 2020 pledge campaign.

Fifteen of the 67 pledge cards were completed by households who did not pledge in 2019. Thank you!

But, even after receiving these new giving estimates, our total pledges are still thirteen less than received the previous year. Our shortfall compared to 2019 is a substantial \$34,155.

We are estimating that the expenses for 2020 will be similar to 2019 based on requests; however, the much lower estimated giving makes it difficult to determine how much money we have for our ministries. There is no question we will need to evaluate all of our budget requests.

Over 20 active households that pledged in 2019 have yet to complete a pledge card for 2020. It is not too late to give us your best estimate of your giving for 2020. A pledge card is not a contract or a firm commitment, it's simply an intention of your giving for the year. Cards are on the back table in the sanctuary. Fill one out and and drop it in the offering plate. We are all in ministry together. Every dollar counts. Thank you.
