St. Mark's Financial Update

Greetings St. Mark's Family,



It's only been about 3 weeks since I wrote our last update, so not much has changed. Our church finances continue to be in a good position because of your strong support. Giving for the month of June is expected to exceed giving in May as well as June of last year. And our expenses continue to be reasonable. All of this relates to a solid cash position. In fact, our account balance hasn't been this high since June 2017. We have about \$12,000 in cash more than what we need to have set aside for our designated accounts.

All of our major payments, including our loan payments and apportionments, continue to be paid on time. We've paid about \$20,000 in apportionments so far this year and are on pace to meet our goal of full payment. And we've reduced our two loans to a total of \$62,400.

- Packs of blue, black or red pens






What's coming up for St. Mark's missions and outreach?

UMCOR

St. Mark's has a long history of supporting **UMCOR**, the **United Methodist Committee on Relief**. We have assembled and donated flood buckets, layette kits, and hygiene kits. We also take a yearly special offering on UMCOR Sunday. The Sunday is typically in March, but because of the disruptions caused by Covid-19, we postponed the offering.

We will collect this special offering on July 26th.

"'For more than 50 years, United Methodist congregations have been taking part in a special offering, laying the foundation for the United Methodist Committee on Relief's ministry of relief and hope. UMCOR's work of alleviating human suffering around the world includes disaster Relief and supplies, disaster risk reduction, health, and humanitarian development.

Gifts to the UMCOR Sunday offering (formerly One Great Hour of Sharing) covers the costs of doing business. This helps UMCOR keep the promise that 100 percent of any gift to a specific UMCOR project will go toward that project, not administrative costs. UMCOR has no source of revenue for administration except from UMCOR Sunday.

Because of UMCOR Sunday, when you hear about a disaster of humanitarian crisis and you give to UMCOR, you can be assured that one hundred percent of the money you designate goes toward people in need."
