Dear St. Mark's family,

We've just experienced a special Palm Sunday service. What is in store for the rest of Holy Week? Read on....

MAUNDY THURSDAY, April 1st: A 40-minute Maundy Thursday service premiers online only at 7 pm. or anytime after (No in-person worship) The service, entitled The Living Last Supper is a combination of 12 stories from the apostles reflecting on their time with Jesus. The service will include special music Holy Communion (have your bread and juice ready to receive at home).

GOOD FRIDAY: A special Good Friday service has been pre-recorded and will be available online to you on Facebook. This very special service — with music provided by Chris Beiser, Hannah Hensler, and Sue Combs; scriptural narration by Mark Hensler, videography by Mrk Hensler, and Rick Kiefer on sound — takes you from the Last Supper, into the Garden of Gethsemane, through the trial, crucifixion, and ends at Jesus' burial. We hope this service provides a powerful message as we prepare our hearts for Easter Sunday.

EASTER EGG HUNT: Saturday, April 3rd at 1 pm. This is a day for us to bring some fun and joy to our St. Mark's children. Because of the pandemic, this event is not publicized to the public. So bring your family, and you can invite friends if you wish. We have 100s and 100s of eggs! Plus, a visit from the Easter Bunny!.

EASTER MORNING WORSHIP AT 9:30. "Christ the Lord is risen today. Alleluia!" We celebrate this holiest day of the Christian year with music by Kayla Goodman, Hannah Hensler, Mark Hensler, Sue Combs, and Chris Beiser. Linda Payne will serve again as liturgist. And, I pray that what I share this day will be a message of hope and encouragement for all. This service, like all other Sunday services, will be in-person and livestreamed. All are invited to attend, using your own judgement, whatever is best for you. If you do plan to attend, please respond to the attendance survey sent by email, or call the church office. Reservations are not required, but this will help us in our planning. Thank you!



St. Mark's Financial Update

Hello St. Mark's Family,

We would like to welcome Don Menke and Bob Pittman to the Finance Committee. We appreciate them being willing to give their time and talents to St. Mark's and look forward to their participation. One of the main purposes of the Finance Committee is to find creative ways to turn their congregations into tithing congregations with attitudes of generosity as well as to develop stewardship campaigns to raise enough funds to meet the budget of the church. As we move into 2021 and beyond, the finance committee will continue exploring these opportunities.

We moved through February with decent results. Giving was down a bit but due to fewer Sundays in the month. We expect this to rebound in March since it has five Sundays.

The expenses to "run the church" in February were pretty standard except for the \$2,000 bill for plowing of the lot due to the various snowfalls we had. Let's hope the rest of the year is snow free.

We are also ahead of our budget after two months. Giving is right on target for the budget and we've spent almost \$5,000 less than projected due to spending less than expected on lower utility costs, not paying the first installment for the annual conference house (we budgeted \$2,000 to rent a house but since the conference will not be occurring in person, we will not spend \$2,000 this year) and lower than budget ed repair/maintenance expenses. So, all together we are \$4,500 ahead of our budget.

Our money in the bank is at \$68,000. We have \$27,000 in the parking lot fund to do the lights and the trustees are currently obtaining quotes. Our excess cash (calculated as total cash less bills outstanding and designated funds) finished February at about \$5,600. As long as the number is positive, we feel good about our financial position.

The finance committee voted to use some of our excess cash to pay off the line of credit loan balance which was used for the concrete work at the parsonage. This leaves us with just one loan – for improvements done several years ago. That loan has a balance of about \$53,00 and around 7 years left until it is paid in full.

In summary, your continued generosity allows St. Mark's to be in a good financial position. Thank you! If you have questions about anything related to St. Mark's finances, please do not hesitate to ask either me or Gale.

Dear friends of Jesus Christ:

I was crestfallen a week ago today when I heard about the tragic loss of life and the enormous physical and moral injury inflicted upon those left behind. My dismay is multi-layered. First of all, there is an apparent singling out of a particular racial, ethnic group. I am well aware that the presumed perpetrator claims otherwise regarding targeting. But layered upon the clear ratcheting up of violence in word and deed toward Asian Americans, race and ethnicity cannot be discounted as a salient factor. The resurgence of anti-Asian rhetoric and violence is hardly new. Old as it is it is nevertheless unacceptable in a civil society. It is abhorrent for people of Christian faith. Or at least it ought to be. We are those who make the claim that upon every person is stamped the image of God. If that which we have preached and taught is true it cannot be true only as an intellectual exercise. It must be embodied.

Secondly the alleged gunman claims in affect that he was trying to exorcise the demonic forces that haunted him. I fully support anyone running in the opposite direction of bad behaviors. But running toward firearms and then turning them outward toward the perceived source of temptation is bad theology and terrible sociology. It is too simplistic and places all of ones troubles outside of the self and is therefore and avoidance of real soul work. Further, in the light of the gospel of Jesus Christ, violence as a problem-solving method personal or societal is short sighted at best and no solution at all at worst.

We have been tracing the life and ministry of Jesus during these Lenten days. Next week, Holy Week, we reach a particular climax. One of the things that dawns on me anew at this stage in the liturgical cycle each year is how much Jesus identifies with our hopes and dreams as well as our pain and suffering. In the course of that he seeks to break the cycles of violence, rage, alienation, and hatred. The message of every Easter is his victory over the worst makes it possible for us to be victorious over all the obstacles to living a God centered, abundant life. But it starts with owning our stuff and standing with all of our wounded fellow pilgrims on the human journey. This week we must name our Asian sisters and brothers specifically and stand with them and for them against all that would seek to dehumanize them. In the name of Jesus let's stand with each and all upon whom the image of God is imprinted.
