Dear St. Mark's Family,

Lenten blessings to you!

As we walk with Jesus to the Cross, I hope you are gaining some deeper understanding of the metaphor we are using during our Lenten Worship Series, Holy Vessels. The author of the series, Marcia McFee, writes,

“Each of us is created a precious and holy vessel of embodied love. We have been through a harrowing time since last Lent that has shattered our sense of wholeness – body, mind, and spirit – like a glass vessel fractured into pieces.”

For sure, we have gone through much this past year. As a glass vessel is broken by the storms of the sea, we have likewise experienced brokenness. We have suffered pain and loss, some more so than others. However, we also understand this truth: we know that God does not will our suffering, but God can redeem it. As those broken pieces of glass are tossed and turned against the waves and the sand, they are polished and become beautiful in their own right. And, like a beachcomber, gathering and marveling at every precious surviving piece of beach glass she finds, Jesus gathers us - broken as we are - to touch us and to remind us of the treasure that we all are – worthy of new life in the midst of hopelessness.

During this Lenten season, may you be reassured that our Crucified and Risen Savior treasures each one of you!

**March 14** – We will mark this anniversary of the lockdown by looking back at all that has taken place this previous year. Also, Daylight Savings Time begins. Don't forget to set your clocks ahead one hour.

## St. Mark's Financial Update

Hello St. Mark's Family,

2021 is off to a good start. Giving for January was strong with over \$35,000 contributed to St. Mark's. Several church families make their annual gift in January so it's typically a strong month. This year we are up 14% over last January.

Our expenses for the month were very typical with nothing out of the ordinary. We spent just over \$23,000 to "run the church" for the month. It may sound like a broken record, but we made our first installment of apportionments on time. We hear that many other churches are struggling to meet their apportionments so we should be proud that we are able.

We are well ahead of our budget as we start out the year – so that's great news. Our money in the bank is at \$74,000 due to the strong giving month, \$27,000 in the parking lot fund to do the lights (and that's more than enough for the project) and designated funds.

Not much else to report as it was a pretty typical and boring month for finances, which is a good thing! In summary, your continued generosity allows St. Mark's to be in a good financial position. Thank you!




# ST. MARK'S MISSIONS and OUTREACH

# MUSIC MINISTRY

You know God makes “art” out of our moments of brokenness, sin, and mistakes. These works are made up of 1000’s of broken pieces, skillfully picked up, dusted off, then masterfully put together into awesome new pieces.

Our Lenten series is going to do just that very thing! We are all going to begin this journey as shattered glass rolling in the sea. We are tossed and tumbled until our sharp edges are smoothed and rounded and then we are finally washed ashore. We have been changed. Each piece can beautifully stand alone, or put many pieces back together to create a vessel that is even more magnificent than the original. I’m so very excited to begin this series!

How will music play a part? Each Sunday will have a theme and the hymns and special music will be selected to go along with that. The hope will be that the music will tie the service together adding another element to compliment the Scripture, prayers, responses, Children’s moment, and sermon. Just as it has been with other series that we’ve done, there will be a couple of songs we will sing as a congregation each week to bring us all together into the service and the theme for that particular Sunday.

For our Maundy Thursday service, I’m putting together a special music/drama presentation that will be recorded to be watched that evening, or at a time convenient to you.

Several years ago the choir presented the cantata “The Living Last Supper”. This cantata was from the point of view of the 12 apostles gathered at the Last Supper. Each apostle tells a short story about their time with Jesus and each ask the haunting question...Is it I that will betray you? 12 men from our congregation will depict the apostles, there will be choir selections from past cantatas, as well as individual musicians providing music that will tie the whole powerful presentation together.

In closing, remember a stained glass window’s pieces individually are just a mess, a scattered jigsaw puzzle. But once the Master’s hand groups these pieces of glass together, the creation is something that takes your breath away!

I look forward to starting this Lenten series with you. I’ll “see” you online or in person on Sunday morning.




# YOUTH GROUP HAPPENINGS


