A Note from Your Pastor regarding our cancelled blood drive.

If you were registered for the June blood drive you may wonder why you received a cancellation notice from the Community Blood Center. I made the difficult decision to cancel this blood drive because of our shared belief that any events held at our church should be open and inclusive of all people.

I became aware of at least two instances where persons were turned away because of the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) current policy against allowing certain gay men from donating blood. In one instance the screener's comments were especially rude.

I believe blood drives are important, and I believe in the need to assure a safe blood supply. But, I believe the current policy is discriminatory. This is my opinion, but it is shared by other organizations such as the American Red Cross, which has publicly opposed this policy:

I am encouraged to learn that the FDA is funding a new study looking at vetting donors based on individual risk, rather than on a blanket prohibition.

I am hoping this study will lead to a positive change in the FDA's policy.

I believe in blood donation. I have given blood for over 40 years, and will continue to do so. At the same time, I would not want any of our church family to be discriminated against at any event held in our church facility. We can give blood while being in opposition to this policy.

As soon as the FDA's policy is changed to reflect more inclusivity - and I believe change is coming - I will heartily recommend that St. Mark's host blood drives once again. — Your pastor, Joe Payne.

New Team Being Formed :

Room at the Table

Hello friends!

We are excited to share with you that the Administrative Council voted unanimously at their April meeting to officially recognize a new core team at St. Mark's, called Room at the Table. The purpose of Room at the Table is to explore with the congregation the possibility of becoming a Reconciling Church. A Reconciling Church is a United Methodist Church that affiliates with the Reconciling Ministries Network (www.rmnetwork.org), and makes this public commitment:

"We celebrate God's gift of diversity and value the wholeness made possible in community equally shared and shepherded by all. We welcome and affirm people of every gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation, who are also of every age, race, ethnicity, physical and mental ability, level of education, and family structure, and of every economic, immigration, marital, and social status, and so much more. We acknowledge that we live in a world of profound social, economic, and political inequities. As followers of Jesus, we commit ourselves to the pursuit of justice and pledge to stand in solidarity with all who are marginalized and oppressed."

Room at the Table began as a group of concerned persons passionate about expanding the inclusivity of St. Mark's to all people, including members of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex and asexual (LGBTQIA+) community. They began meeting informally in 2019 to discuss this concept. <u>Recognition of this team in no way obligates St. Mark's to becoming a Reconciling Church. Instead, it allows the group to be fully transparent as we explore this concept together.</u>

Members of Room at the Table believe the time is right for this discussion, considering the upcoming vote and probable split of the United Methodist Church in 2022. As a congregation, we will need to decide our position on LGBTQ+ inclusivity. Room at the Table feels strongly we should be proactive rather than reactive regarding this decision.

We also understand the importance of giving people the time and space to reach this decision. This includes engaging in honest, graceful conversations with each other. The Room at the Table team intends to offer education in the form of bible study, book studies, documentary watch parties, LGBTQ+ panel speakers, etc. But, most importantly, *graceful conversations*. We need to give everyone the opportunity to tell their story, where they are in this journey, and to decide together St. Mark's future pathway.

There is no formal timeline, but it is generally believed that this discernment could at minimum be a twelvemonth process. As a side note, there are four Reconciling Churches in southwest Ohio, although the closest ones are in Clifton, Hyde Park, and Dayton. We could fill a huge gap in this area if we decide to become Reconciling.

ST. MARK'S TRUSTEES

Our Trustees are busy! Many projects for the church and parsonage have been completed or are about to begin:

- * Thanks to Jeff Gering, Gil Dole, Don Stewart, Bob Mendenhall, Pastor Joe, and the scouts for mulching the church and parsonage.
- * Thanks to Jeff Gering for taking the lead in beautifying our courtyard. Jeff moved some shrubbery and replanted them in the courtyard. With the help of Gil Dole, the courtyard was mulched. Marty and Gay Kubik planted some daisies to add color. Jeff then power washed the flagstones and filled in between the stones with fresh gravel. He completed the job by sealing the stones. Our youth are painting the metal furniture. The courtyard is beautiful!
- * Have you noticed how dark it is in sections of our hallways? It's all because some of our fluorescent lights have old non-working ballasts. So, those old fixtures will soon be replaced with more energy efficient LEDs.
- * An electrician has been secured to replace outdated and faulty wiring in the youth room, install a ground-fault outlet in the upstairs restroom, and another outlet in the Youth Director office.
- * A bid has been received to add additional lighting for our parking lot. Monies received from our recent capital campaign will cover this project.
- * The plumber has replaced the parsonage hot water heater pressure relief valve.
- * A leak in the parsonage roof will be repaired by Ray St.Clair roofing. .
- * Measurements are being made of the parsonage kitchen door for a storm door replacement.
- * Two ceiling fans will be installed in the parsonage: one in a bedroom and another in the main dining area.

St. Mark's Financial Update

Hello St. Mark's Family,

We're 1/3 of the way through the year so far and our financial results are solid. We have received over \$106,800 in total giving. This is within \$1,000 of our budget, but is about

\$11,000 behind this point last year. Some of this is attributed to a \$3,500 COVID grant we received from the conference and increased giving related to the pandemic.

Our expenses to "run the church" through the first four months are about \$100,000 which is \$3,000 less than the same time period last year. And we have spent about \$6,000 less than budgeted. There were no major unplanned expenses for the year. We have paid our apportionments each month. We also paid off the line of credit loan – freeing up \$500 per month that was formerly used for the loan payment.

Our money in the bank is at \$70,000. We have \$27,500 in the parking lot fund to do the lights and the trustees are currently obtaining quotes. Our total cash nearly equals our total of bills outstanding and designated funds. As long as the number is positive or not negative, we feel good about our financial position.

In summary, your continued generosity allows St. Mark's to be in a decent financial position. Thank you! If you have questions about anything related to St. Mark's finances, please do not hesitate to ask either me or Gale.
