PASTOR JOE'S JOTS

Dear Church Family,

What a summer! We've had two Dessert & Discussions, Bible studies, and new member classes. On top of that, VBS begins this week. All of this and more, as we live in the midst of a global pandemic that doesn't seem to be ending any time soon.

According to the CDC, the Covid 19 Delta variant is spreading rapidly among vaccinated and unvaccinated persons, which is causing a rise in cases. There is so much conflicting information and it is difficult to sort out. Regardless, the CDC is recommending that we

mask when indoors even if we are vaccinated.

So, what does this mean for the people of St. Mark's, particularly regarding worship? Right now, our current policy states that vaccinated individuals may worship unmasked, and unvaccinated individuals are encouraged - but not required - to mask. Children in G.L.O.W. kids' ministry and their adult leaders will continue to mask.

To say that we are weary from this is likely an understatement. At the same time, I know we want to remain safe. Personally, I feel protected because I have been vaccinated and I am in good health. However, it may be a different story for those who are unvaccinated or vaccinated but live with a weakened immune system. I am not a health expert and don't pretend to be. While the scriptures tell us that God is our help in times of trouble, the scriptures also teach us to not put God to the test. We need to use good judgment.

So, my suggestion is that you do whatever you feel is best for you. So, receive guidance from your physician. You may decide to come to worship masked or unmasked. Or, you may choose to stay home. Although we will miss seeing you, there will be no judgment either way.

I do know this: we will get through this. Programs will continue as best we can. So hang in there. Stay safe. And know that God is with us every step of the way.
