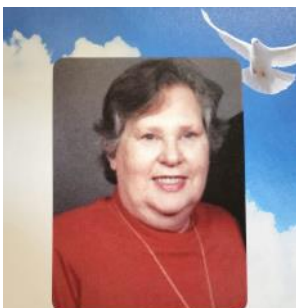

Dear Church Family,

Right now, a pair of robins are busy attempting to build a nest right outside the parsonage kitchen door. I admit they are making a mess. But that's how life is. It can be messy.

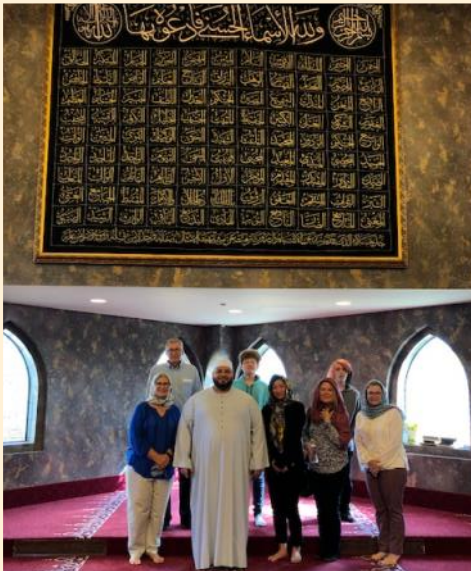
On Easter, April 17, we celebrate the Resurrection! To help us celebrate in a big way, our choir is returning to the chancel for the first time in over two years.

St. Mark's Little Free Pantry

In May 2016, Jessica McClard launched the grassroots Little Free Pantry movement. By August 2016 the movement was global. Throughout the US and internationally, the grassroots mini pantry movement continues growing and moving. In the Cincinnati area 1 in 7 neighbors are at risk of hunger, 1-11 seniors are food insecure, and 76,000 children in the Tri-state live with hunger. The need for food has increased by 60% since the onset of the Covid 19 pandemic.

Brick and mortar pantries cannot fill the needs of every person experiencing hunger but, We can help!

Neighborhood Little Free Pantries fill immediate needs for many families, seniors and the working poor. They serve as a safety net for those who might fall through the cracks, people who feel embarrassment and shame accepting help from a brick and mortar pantry. Neighbors that work during normal pantry open hours. And, families that might have short term emergency needs. The Little Free Pantry creates neighborhood space for exercising compassion, trust and mutual aid.

This will be an ongoing mission opportunity and lesson in generous giving for our G.L.O.W. kids.



And while Children and Families will maintain the pantry, anyone is welcome to donate goods.

The Little Free Pantry will be located, in the greenspace, between the Fairfield Ave entrance and the parsonage driveway. It is a well lit and easily accessible.

Acceptable items: Canned veggies, fruits, proteins. Personal care items, Paper goods, Non-perishable boxed food items, Laundry detergent, and Diapers.

Non acceptable items: Clothing, Food items in glass jars, Chemicals, Razors or other sharp items.

We are very grateful for Bob Hamp who supplied the material and built our Little Free Pantry, to Danny Thomas for his help in planning, and to Troop 960 for installing it.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

TIM MISLANSKY, TREASURER
GALE GOODMAN, FINANCE CHAIR

Greetings St. Mark's Family,

Our new year is off to a good start and giving is up! We received \$26,200 in February and have received \$61,400 for the year. This puts us about \$5,000 more than last year.

We spent about \$25,800 during the month and \$54,700 for the year to "run the church." This is up from last year, but offset by our increased giving. Half of our increased spending is in salaries for our staff and the rest is spread out among a number of categories like office supplies, utilities and utilities.

We ended the month with about \$620,800 at the credit union. Of this, approximately \$20,000 is in the parking lot fund as we work to wrap up that project and \$41,000 is in designated funds. We also ended the month with about \$2,000 in bills due. We are still "borrowing" from ourselves as we do not have enough cash to pay out all the bills and the designated accounts. This amount varies over time but typically is between \$1,000 and \$10,000. We ended February with just less than \$1,000 in borrowings from our designated accounts.
