MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JOE



Dear St. Mark's family,

One of my favorite childhood activities was of exploring the woods behind our house. The Payne home was in the foothills of southern Ohio, and our woods was a great place to enjoy and to just be a kid. That day, my eleven-year-old legs took me a little further than I had ever been before, to a dry creek bed that seemed to go on and on. I had great fun exploring this and that, seeing sights I had never seen before. There were no fences that divided property lines, so who knows how far I ventured that day. All I knew at the time was the fun I was having, kind of lost in my thoughts and just enjoying myself.

Pretty soon it was time to head home. Probably long past time. So, I turned around and began walking back the same way I came, following that creek bed. Except, my joy turned to dread as I searched fruitlessly for the familiar path that would take me home. Nothing looked familiar, and for the first time in my life, I had the feeling of being lost in that woods, all alone.

After meandering here and there, I finally found familiar surroundings and began making my way home. Pretty soon, I heard the faint voice of my mother calling for me. She had begun to worry and was outside the house, calling my name. I tell you what, her voice never sounded so sweet as it did that day. I yelled back, "I'm coming!" Then, I heard her familiar scolding tone, "Joe, don't you ever go so far in the woods again!" With tears in my eyes, I responded, "I was just thinking the same thing myself!"

My response must have tickled my mother, because she never grew tired of recalling that story to others. She would laugh and laugh as she mimicked my tearful response called down to her from the woods. As a teenager and young adult, hearing her tell that story embarrassed me to no end. But, that didn't matter to her. "A parent's job is to embarrass their kids," she'd say with a grin.

It's been nine years since Mom breathed her last. I miss her, and, as much as it embarrassed me then, I wish I could hear her tease me once more. As I think back to that time of being lost in the woods, I knew my mom saw her job as much more than to "embarrass" her kids. Her job was to love and care for me and my seven siblings. The way she stood outside the house calling for me reminded me of two characters in Jesus' parables: the father who waited outside for his prodigal son to return, and the farmer who left his 99 sheep to search for the single lost one. I believe my mother embodied the love that Jesus has for you and me and all His children.

I am thankful for this and other treasured memories I hold dear of this sweet woman whose calling in life was to raise her family the best way she knew how, and to never stop worrying about us and loving us with the same love that Jesus has for you and me. And yes, for teasing her kids, too. In love, of course.

So, during this month in which we celebrate mothers, I give thanks for my mom who loved me and my siblings. I give thanks also for all who love and care for others, as Jesus loves and cares for us


There will be a mouth-watering selection of dessert options too. This is your chance to get out your favorite salad and/or dessert recipes and share it with everyone!



FINANCIAL UPDATE

TIM MISLANSKY, TREASURER GALE GOODMAN, FINANCE CHAIR

Greetings St. Mark's Family,

March was not a strong month in terms of giving with only \$21,500 coming into the church. This was the lowest month since February of 2021. Online giving remains solid and continues to grow. However, regular giving is down.

We ended the month at nearly \$53,000 at the credit union. A poor giving month and higher than usual expenses caused our cash position to suffer. We are now borrowing almost \$8,300 from ourselves – a near \$7,500 change from the prior month.

Year-to-date, giving is up about \$2,000 or 2%. However, expenses are up almost \$10,000 or 13%. The biggest increases are in staff costs (\$4,500), utilities (\$2,600) and repairs (\$1,700). Overall, we received \$449 less than we spent.

We continue to make our loan payments on time and have paid 1/3 of our total apportionment bill for 2022.

Despite the poor giving month in March, our year-to-date giving is the highest it has been in the past ten years. This can somewhat be attributed to the "newer" trend of people giving an annual gift in January. 




