MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JOE



Dear St. Mark's Family,

We are on a journey, an exploration, of what it might mean to become a Reconciling Church. I know there continue to be questions, and I am glad, because it provides an opportunity to share what is known. I hope the following questions and responses will go a long way to help.

What would it mean for St. Mark's to become a Reconciling Church?

Voting with a 75% or higher majority to become a Reconciling Church means we would become a part of the Reconciling Ministries Network. Joining this network of more than 1,000 United Methodist churches across the globe indicates our readiness to be a public witness to our community for the full inclusion of ALL people, including LGBTQ persons, in the life of the church. This includes but is not limited to our readiness to vote in favor of LGBTQ inclusive issues within the United Methodist denomination; intentionally engage in dialogue, build relationships, and advocate for changes to Church policies related to ordination, marriage equality, and the availability of funds that help make LGBTQ justice a reality; and allow LGBTQ people to become congregation members and staff. Donations to the RMN are recommended, but not required when identifying as a Reconciling Church.

Why should we move ahead now when our denomination is still sorting out these details?

By becoming a Reconciling Church now, St. Mark's will signal to southwest Ohio that ALL people are welcomed, included, and fully affirmed at St. Mark's. St. Mark's identity as a Reconciling Ministry is not tied to General Conference or its vote, but rather is based on the beliefs of the St. Mark's congregation and who we want to be.

What exactly is the Reconciling Ministries Network, what are their values, and what are we communicating by becoming a member?

Becoming a Reconciling Church means we subscribe to and agree to post this statement on our Website: We celebrate God's gift of diversity and value the wholeness made possible in community equally shared and shepherded by **all**. We welcome and affirm people of every gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation, who are also of every age, race, ethnicity, physical and mental ability, level of education, and family structure, and of every economic, immigration, marital, and social status, and so much more. We acknowledge that we live in a world of profound social, economic, and political inequities. As followers of Jesus, we commit ourselves to the pursuit of justice and pledge to stand in solidarity with all who are marginalized and oppressed.

CHARITABLE FUND REALLOCATION POLICY

During the month of June, the St. Mark's United Methodist Church Finance Committee, with support from Trustees, brought forward a policy addition to the Administrative Council. The intent of the policy is to support the reallocation of designated funds when the designated project no longer exists. Prior to approval, the Finance Committee researched best practices from other churches and reviewed IRS guidelines.

The Charitable Fund reallocation policy includes noting that all reasonable effort would be made to use the designated gift for the purpose in which it was designated, and the Finance committee will reallocate the contribution to another related fund (not any general funds) with notification to the Admin Board and congregation of St. Mark's United Methodist Church. The policy passed unanimously on June 17, 2022.

Patriotism is at the heart of America and a strong representation of that spirit is Lee Greenwood's popular 1984 hit song "God Bless The USA". The song is not only a display of American pride, but it

also has served as a tribute to many moments in our recent history. The song reached its popularity height in 1991 during the Gulf War. Following 9/11 the song resurged once again in rallies and vigils across the nation. During Hurricane Katrina the song became a beacon of hope. This song tugs at the heartstrings of those who hear it every time it's played or sung. The words spark so many emotions, this holds true in several instances for myself.



"If tomorrow all the things were gone I worked for all my life, and I had to start again with just my children and my wife. I'd thank my lucky stars to be living here today, cause the flag still stands for freedom and they can't take that away."

The summers that I performed in the live shows at Kings Island were some of the most memorable in my young adult life. In 1992, I performed in a country show that used "God Bless the USA" as the finale song for the production. The show was guite popular and being outdoors many people would be gathered around the perimeter of the theater listening for a bit before moving on. It was consistent every show that as soon as that song began the audience would stand and the area around the theater was quickly filled with people saluting, cheering, and even singing along. What an awesome thing to happen 4 times a day, 6 days a week all summer long!

Sue's amazing father Lee Combs Jr. enlisted in 1943 and served in the United States Navy during World War II. One very special thing he and Sue got to share together was in the summer of 2010. Lee

Being with men and women from across the country who were veterans from many different branches of the service and wars was a memorable and rewarding experience for both of them. Sue said they would go to each memorial and the stories would flow of the heroic sad and happy moments each individual had experienced. I was at the airport when the group returned and the welcome these veterans received was amazing. Current military lined the walls, followed by family, friends, and onlookers. Spontaneous applause, waving signs, and shouts of appreciation greeted them as they walked through the airport. Our ability to greet them in such a joyous manner was because of their defending our flag for the freedoms we are blessed

to have each day.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

TIM MISLANSKY, TREASURER GALE GOODMAN, FINANCE CHAIR

Greetings St. Mark's Family,



1 Timothy 6:17-19: "As for the rich in this present age, charge them not to be haughty, nor to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly provides us with everything to enjoy. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share, thus storing up treasure for themselves as a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of that which is truly life."

We had another solid month of giving in May. We received nearly \$33,000 for the month. Year-to-date, we have received just over \$149,000, compared to \$129,000 for the same period last year. This is a big increase of \$20,000 or 16%—a sign of healthy giving in our church.

We spent \$32,400 in the month of May. This was up considerably from the prior month as the trustees have started a project related to upgrading our bathrooms. Because the church is a non-residential building, we need architectural drawings of the bathrooms. Other than that one time expense, our expenses were pretty typical.

We ended the month at nearly \$47,000 at the credit union. Because of the high expenses in May, we increased the amount we are borrowing from ourselves by \$2,200 and are now borrowing about \$6,600 from ourselves. Considering the atypical expenses of the sound system upgrade and the architectural drawings, we are not in a bad position. We continue to pay our share of apportionments each month as well as our loan payment.

Also of interest is that we moved \$20,000 left from the parking lot remodel to a building improvement funds. These funds will be used by trustees for future projects.

At a recent meeting there were some comments made about the church's finances being in an unhealthy state because we borrow from our designated funds at times and that is something we did not do five or ten years ago. Each person is entitled to their own opinion, but we believe we are actually in a healthy state and healthier than we were in the past. Here's why:

- P Year to date giving is up 20% from last year.
- \triangleright Our giving in 2022 is at the highest level in 2012.
- Pe We actually spend less to "run the church" than we did five years ago when you exclude the capital projects and apportionments. This shows we are managing our expenses well despite costs increasing.
- We have fulfilled our commitment to the United Methodist Church by paying our apportionments for the last five years. Our apportionments are around \$40,000 per year.
 Prior to 2017, we were generally paying less than \$10,000 per year towards apportionments. This accounts for part of the reason we need to borrow from ourselves occasionally.
- Each "project" that has come up over the past few years (parking lot, sound system, etc.) have been able to be fulfilled and funded.
- \triangleright We have reduced the debt of the church by nearly \$40,000.

We should feel good about our financial position. We are meeting the needs of the church in our ministries, paying our operating expenses, paying down our debt and supporting the larger United Methodist Church through our faithful payment of apportionments. All of this is thanks to your generosity and support of St. Marks.

Hopefully, this update finds you cool from the recent heat waves. Thankfully, the first weekend in June was a cool morning with 19 strong people! We were able to trim bushes, pull lots of weeds, weed treat the church lawn, clean the kitchen, wipe down the pews and wash the windows. This is only a few duties listed but, A BIG, "Thank You" to all who joined us.

If you missed out, never fear, we have "Helping Hands" as an ongoing effort to identify those who can spend time working on areas in and around the church with minor updates, clean ups or necessary tasks. Sign up on the back of the Attendance sheet and a St. Mark's Trustee will contact you.

Additionally, the list of items that we are seeking for Helping hands is posted on the bulletin board in the **Narthex.** This list will be updated as items are completed or new needs arise. We all can join in to help keep St. Marks beautiful!

In addition too keeping St. Mark's beautiful, we have projects to repair and maintain the church. Matt Snyder and Bob Mendenhall recently completed an Accessibility and Disability Audit provided by the conference ADA Committee. Audits may seem daunting, but the ADA audit provided your Trustees with a baseline and highlighted areas to focus on. The details of this audit are available.

In summary, we scored Bronze, the scoresheet notes that Bronze indicates the church is welcoming and offers basic amenities needed for a person with a disability to participate. For example, a place to park, a way to get into the building and sanctuary, a usable bathroom, etc. We know that we have work to do in improving the entrance (on Symmes Road) and our bathrooms.

As a public space, any bathroom change requires the City of Fairfield to provide oversight, including architectural drawings to be submitted. We have secured the architect and will be working over the next several weeks to understand what updates and changes are possible. This is the first step in updating the bathrooms in our church facility. For more information contact Jennie Marshall, Trustee Chair.
