What day is this worship commentary describing?

My father was a quiet, gentle, man with a dry sense of humor. He loved his family, his friends, and especially his sports. I always felt I was the disappointing child

because I did not have the same passion as he did for sports. My father was a basketball and football player in high school. While at Kentucky Wesleyan University, he was on their championship basketball team, and continued

playing for various pick up teams for years. He bowled at least three times a week. For the Thursday night church league, he helped his team to bring home many a trophy for St. Mark's! When my father developed Parkinson's he gave up these sports but just could not sit still, as a result he



developed a great love for golf which he played until he could not hold the clubs.



I gave little league my best shot for many years. I was a right fielder. While in the field I excelled in daisy chains and hoping the center fielder could run fast enough to catch the ball if it came my way. I loved the special treat tickets we received for winning a game and for some reason was placed on the best teams year after year, so treat tickets were plentiful!

I enjoyed music and theater from a very young age and although my father hoped I'd excel in sports he was so proud I excelled in the arts. I will always remember him telling a friend I had more talent in my big toe than in his whole body. Seeing him in the audience at a school or college concert, or a theatrical production made it difficult to perform from getting so choked up on tears.

This tall man that I always looked up too began to weaken as Parkinson's continued to take control of his body. No more basketball, bowling, or golf. He eventually was confined to a wheelchair and began to lose some of his memory capabilities as well. One thing my father was also very good at was the upkeep and maintenance of a car, me not so much. He would always say to me... "make sure you change your oil."

At one of my dad's doctors appointments the doctor told me that Parkinson's was causing my dads brain to work like a lighter,



sometimes it lights the first time, sometimes it takes several tries before the flame happens. He will remember some things and then not, it will be very inconsistent. At my mothers funeral it came time to take my dad back to the nursing home, he had watched people the whole service with no acknowledgement of who they were, but when I said goodbye to him, he looked at me and clear as ever said, " make sure you change your oil".

So even though he was sports, I was the arts, together we had an amazing father and son relationship. Everyday, I miss him still. A song helps me through during the difficult times, "You Raise Me Up"... You raise me up to walk on mountains. You raise me up to walk on stormy seas. I am strong when I'm on your shoulders. You raise me up to be more than I can be. Proverbs 23: 26...a righteous son is one who gives God his heart and keeps his attention trained on His ways.



FINANCIAL UPDATE

TIM MISLANSKY, TREASURER GALE GOODMAN, FINANCE CHAIR

Greetings St. Mark's Family,



...know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask Him!

— Matthew 7: 9-10

April was a strong month of giving... which was a relief after our poor March. We had over \$33,000 coming into the church. Most of our typical monthly expenses were in line with other months. Our expenses were a bit above usual as we paid our quarterly insurance bill of about \$2,000 and spent \$2,000 from the operating budget (unbudgeted) to fund the remainder of the video and sound system upgrades.

Year-to-date, giving is up about \$9,000 or 5%.

However, expenses are up almost \$12,000 or 12%. The biggest increases are in staff costs (\$6,800), utilities (\$4,000) and capital projects/repairs (\$2,300). These are somewhat offset by reductions in apportionments (\$1,800). Overall, we have received \$3,400 more than we spent for the year. We continue to make our loan payments on time and have paid 1/3 of our total apportionment bill for 2022.

We ended the month at nearly \$53,000 at the credit union.

Because of the strong giving in April, we were able to reduce the amount we are borrowing from ourselves by \$4,400 and are now borrowing just under \$4,000 from ourselves. We used \$5,300 from memorial funds to help offset the cost of the video and sound upgrades.


