






Our big mission for the week... was our "Fill the Truck" event for New Life Furniture. We made several trips to members' home to pick

MUSIC MINISTRY





FINANCIAL UPDATE

TIM MISLANSKY, TREASURER GALE GOODMAN, FINANCE CHAIR

Greetings St. Mark's Family,

After a few months of really solid giving, we experienced some summer blues in June. We received only \$18,500 for the month. This is our worst giving month since May 2018. Year-to-date, we have received just over \$167,000, compared to \$155,000 for the same period last year. This is still a nice increase of \$12,000 or 8% - a sign of healthy giving in our church.

We spent \$22,400 in the month of June. This was lower than a normal month and good news since our giving was lower. Even with the reduced giving, we spent more than \$3,400 than we brought in. While this can be concerning, it's only one month. And one month does not make a trend.

Our expenses for this year are up \$17,000 from last year. The increases are in salaries (\$10,000) and capital improvements (\$7,000). All other categories are on target or have very minor increases compared to last year. We ended the month at about \$44,900 at the credit union. Because of the low giving in June, we increased the amount we are borrowing from ourselves by \$3,200 and are now borrowing about \$9,800 from ourselves.

We made our loan payment on time again and our debt is down to \$42,700. We also made an apportionment payment and have covered one-half of our annual apportionment bill.

As noted in July as part of the Accessibility and Disability Audit completed, we identified a gap in the pavement and threshold at the Symmes Road entrance, making wheelchairs coming in difficult. The pavement in that area will be lifted by A-1 Concrete Leveling in early August and should greatly improve the ability for wheelchair entry into the church.

We continue to work with the architect and the city on possibilities for the bathrooms and are eagerly waiting for further details to share.




