

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JOE



Dear St. Mark's Family,

I love the Bible.

The Bible contains some of the loftiest and most beautiful verses in literature. It is life-giving. It is life-affirming. As I read and study this sacred book, I know that millions—perhaps

billions— also look to it for inspiration and guidance. It is a gift passed down to us from thousands of years ago, and we should never take that gift for granted.

At the same time, if we are honest, we must admit that some parts of the Bible may seem confusing and others deeply disturbing. If you have ever felt this way, I want to assure you that you are not alone. Many have these same feelings, but most do not care to admit it. What do we do with these confusing and/or disturbing passages? Do we ignore them? Do we take them at face value? Do we randomly pick and choose what we believe? What do we do?

Last Sunday (August 21) I began a new sermon series entitled, "Wrestling With the Bible." During this series, I'm going to give you a few tools that may help you as you seek to understand and even gain life from the whole Bible, and not just the "easy to understand" parts. These tools will not give you all of the answers on a silver platter. They will, however, help you in your wrestling. They will help you in applying your heart and mind to these sacred texts.

I began the series last week, but it's not too late to join us. I hope to see you in person, or view us livestream.

WHY REMAIN UMC? FOUR-WEEK STUDY BEGINS SEPTEMBER 8

A heartfelt thank you to all who attended our congregational forum on August 7th, both in-person and online. Almost 70 people joined us! We are pleased with the turnout and the engagement from many of our members.

Beginning September 8, you are invited to attend another educational opportunity. It is a 4-week study called, "The United Methodist Church: Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow."

"This small group study, created by the Alabama-West Florida Reconciling Ministries Team, helps fill the void many were feeling in understanding the situation within the United Methodist Church. Although everyone brings their own biases, the team designed the study to be non-dualistic, truthful, and helpful to anyone trying to understand the political turmoil in the UMC. The people who designed the study are all people who plan to stay in the UMC and hope for a more just, diverse, and inclusive future."

This study has a weekly video component and allows time for discussion. We will offer an in-person option on Thursdays in September- September 8, 15, 22, and 29th- from 1:00-2:15 in the Fellowship Hall. We will also offer a Zoom option on the same Thursday evenings in September from 6:30-7:45. A working camera and microphone on your pc, laptop, tablet, or smart phone are required (most devices have these, with desktop computers being the exception).


SIT STILL MY HEART

FINANCIAL UPDATE

GALE GOODMAN, FINANCE CHAIR

Greetings St. Mark's Family,



Colossians 3:23

Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters. As we noted last month, June's giving was the lowest since May, 2018. We did rebound a bit in July, receiving \$19,100 for the month. Even with the lower amounts received in June and July, year-to-date giving still reflects a 3% increase over the same period last year.

Lower giving coupled with increased expenses, the cash position of the Church was uncomfortably low. We were able to make the loan payment to the Credit Union therefore, bringing our amount owed to \$41,800. All expenses have been paid for the month. However, we were not able to pay our apportionments for the month of July. This marks the first time in quite awhile that we have not been able to make that payment. With the summer traveling season drawing to a close in August and September, we are expecting the cash position of the Church to rebound and become stronger.

As many of you know, Tim and Julie have relocated to Dayton. Therefore, Tim has asked that we replace him as Treasurer of St. Mark's. He has graciously given us several months' notice to the end of his tenure. So, it is with a great amount of gratitude and respect that we say a "so long", never a good bye, to Tim. He has brought a great amount of knowledge and understanding to this position and his position as Finance Committee Chair. I, for one, will miss his expertise, dedication, and sense of humor. <u>Thank you does not begin to express what he has brought to this position and to St. Mark's</u>.



It is as this time, that I would like to welcome Bill and Lynne Schumacker as our new Treasurer Team. Tim has met with them and started the training process to transition the position to them. We are excited to have both of them working on this position. Tim will still be working closely with Bill and Lynne during this transition. Tim did make sure that he gave a cellphone number to Bill and Lynne in the event that they had any questions. *(I just hope it was his number)*. Please take a moment when you see Tim to thank him for his service to St. Mark's, as well as, welcoming Bill and Lynne into their new positions.

Our Trustees are very thankful for the extra Helping Hands during the Youth Mission Week!

Is there another area that needs attention or items you've noticed? <u>Helping Hands is here</u>!

This ongoing effort is focused not only on identifying those who can spend time working on areas in and around the church with minor updates, clean ups or necessary tasks, but also to identify the areas needing attention. <u>Note on the back of the Attendance/Welcome sheet if you can help OR</u> <u>note an area needing attention.</u> A St. Mark's Trustee will contact you. We are also keeping the list of items that we are <u>seeking helping hands posted</u> <u>on the bulletin board in the Narthex</u>. We all can join in to help keep St. Marks beautiful! As noted in July as part of the Accessibility and Disability Audit completed, we identified a gap in the pavement and threshold at the Symmes Road entrance, making wheelchairs coming in difficult. The pavement in that area will be lifted by A-1 Concrete Leveling in early August and should greatly improve the ability for wheelchair entry into the church.
