MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JOE



Dear St. Mark's Family,

Happy October! It's autumn, which means it's time for sweaters, falling leaves, Fall Festival, all things pumpkin spice, and reading the Bible. That's right. Of course, there is never a bad time to read the Bible, but as I shared in my sermon on September 26, beginning this fall, I'm inviting you to join me in reading the Bible for all its worth.

A couple of sharp listeners pointed out that I only shared four tips. And by golly, they were right! It was a case of looking up and back down to my notes and skipping number three. Oops! So here are all five:

First, if you're going to read the Bible, set a goal. One possible goal is to read one of the four Gospels by the end of this year. You pick which one. Mark is the shortest, John is the longest and deepest spiritually, and Matthew & Luke are in between. It might be nice to read Matthew or Luke this Advent, since those two tell stories of Jesus' birth. But, it's up to you.

Second, get a good study Bible. Consider it an early Christmas present to yourself. A study Bible has notes at the bottom of the page that aids in understanding the biblical text. It helps to make sense of the Bible. Four suggestions for good study Bibles are "The Access Bible." "The Disciple's Study Bible." And the more "scholarly" "Oxford Annotated Bible" and "The New Interpreters Bible."

Third (this is the one I skipped!), take notes. Bibles are meant to be used, so don't be afraid to write in it. Perhaps you could buy a little journal that you keep with your bible if you'd like to write longer entries.

Fourth, at times you may want to read a text three times. First time make it a casual reading. Second time, read slowly and look for details you may have missed. Third, read again, prayerfully.

And fifth, as you read, think on these questions: What does this reveal to me about God? What does this reveal to me about human beings? And, What does this reveal to me about the relationship between God and human beings (including you!)?

All right. So trying these five things, I think you'll find you can read the Bible for all it's worth. And why do we do this? John tells us: "... these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name."

—John 20:31.

DIRECTOR OF YOUTH MINISTRY JULIE MISLANSKY


We have kicked-off a new school year which means re-setting the calendar for our youth group as well!






MUSIC MINISTRY

Dear St. Mark's Family,

<u>Last month</u>, I mentioned that giving had decreased through the summer months. Currently giving, has been somewhat lower than anticipated on a weekly basis through September. We have been able to keep the expenses paid as well as the loan payments have continued to be made.

However, I am sorry to say that the apportionments were not paid in July and August. We are hopeful that we will be able to make a payment in September. At the end of August, we had \$51,600 on deposit at the Credit Union. The loan balance at the Credit Union stands at \$40,796.

Training for Bill and Lynne Schumacker is continuing. We appreciate the time Tim Mislansky is spending with Bill and Lynne.

As always, if you have questions regarding the finances of St. Mark's, please feel free to reach out to me. If I do not have an answer for you, I will certainly seek one out.

LETTER FROM TRUSTEES CHAIR, JENNIE MARSHALL

OCTOBER 30, SUNDAY, AFTER WORSHIP, CHURCH CONFERENCE

Our Presiding Elder and guest preacher for the day will be the Rev. Patricia Matthews. All are welcome to attend; voting privileges are granted to professing members of St. Mark's UMC in attendance at the meeting. Also on the agenda will be the following from Trustees:

The Board of Trustees will bring forward recommendations to our Church Conference on Sunday, October 30. *The first item will be a recommendation* to sell the half-acre lot located at 4660 Anthony Wayne Ave., Fairfield, OH (see photo). As background, St. Mark's UMC purchased the lot in May of 1996 with the intention for future growth and expansion, especially parking. We currently have 152 parking spaces and no foreseeable need to add any more. Since that time, we have been doing almost nothing with the lot except to mow it. The value of the lot, per Butler County Auditor site, is \$37,830.

St. Mark's UMC Trustees intend to use the proceeds of this potential sale of property to assist us in funding upcoming major repairs and maintenance projects, with the primary focus on updating the church bathrooms (become ADA compliant), replacing the aging roof, and updating the parsonage bathrooms.

The second recommendation (if the first is approved) is to approve the names of the individuals who will officially sign paperwork in the sale (Chair of Trustee and one other individual).






