Three youth have "aged in" and are just joining us, the fourth is a friend of one of our long-time youth group members.


We had a fun first meeting together; we started a new bible study and had a scavenger hunt throughout the church.



November always brings thoughts of blessings received from family,

friends, and our ever present Lord.

I am certainly blessed with all of these things weekly as I serve St. Mark's as the Music Director. I wanted to share this article with you that was given to me a few weeks ago. I think it holds true as "traditional" music has changed so much in churches.

Things have changed. There aren't as many people participating in church choirs these days. Some have gone to sing in the heavenly choir. Some of the voices have weakened a bit. Some have lost a portion of their vocal range. The traditional way of doing things is disappearing. Many choir don't sing in robes anymore, instrumentation has changed, the piano and organ again are supplemented with drums and guitars. Things definitely have changed, and change is inevitable (and sometimes very healthy!)



However, choral singing is still beautiful. Dynamics are still breathtaking. Articulation and phrasing are still painting vivid pictures of the text. Good breath support is still creating notes that are on pitch and carry with them great depth and sound. Choir members are still dedicated to working hard each week to bless the Lord and His people.

What has not changed is the fact that choir is still one of the most beautiful and engaging ministries in a church... It provides a powerful expression of praise and worship that a soloist, band, or congregation cannot do.

So make sure your choir (as we are so fortunate to still have one) is affirmed and appreciated. It takes a lot of commitment to create and maintain a church choir.

Pray for your choir members regularly, let them know how much you are inspired by their ministry. Which I must say the congregation at St. Mark's does all of these things...so keep it up!

Hurray for church choir members! May God continue to use them powerfully in a world that desperately needs to hear their message! I love and am blessed with an amazing church family, pastor, and church choir family.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

GALE GOODMAN, FINANCE CHAIR



Psalm 73:26

When all else fails, God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever. Dear St. Mark's Family,

For the last several months, giving to St. Mark's Giving has been slowing. We have been hopeful that our summer blues would start to wain as fall approached. We received \$21,782 in giving for the month of September. Year-to-date, we have received \$242,884. This amount can be compared to the same period in 2021 with that amount being \$240,451. So, we are still outpacing giving in 2022 compared to 2021 by \$2,400. At the end of September, we have \$48,060 on deposit at the credit union.

During the month of September, we spent \$25,056. Which compared to the \$21,782 we received, we spent \$3,275 more than what was given. Through September 2022, our year-to-date expenses were \$232,850 compared to the year-to-date expenses for 2021 of \$234,039. I think it is important to point out that in 2021 all apportionments had been paid. Thus far in 2022, we have not been able to pay them in July, August, or September. I also want to note, that we have continued to pay the loan at the Credit Union. The loan balance stands at \$40,107 at the end of September.

You may ask, "If our cash balance at the credit union is \$48,060 why can't the apportionments be paid?" Well, there is a simple answer for that. When a gift is given to a Church or non-profit organization and that gift is designated for a particular fund (IE: Music Ministry, Youth, St Mark's Cares, etc.), that gift has to be used for that purpose. Therefore, we can not take a gift given for a designated fund and apply it to the General Fund. We have \$47,851 in designated funds on our financial statements. The difference between the cash balance and the designated funds is very close. We have to start borrowing from ourselves to cover the expenses when the cash balance dips below the designated funds balance. You will recall, Tim would speak about borrowing from ourselves, and that in short is what was and is meant.

<u>We have chosen not to pay the apportionments because</u> we would have to start borrowing from ourselves more. We are not comfortable doing that. LETTER FROM TRUSTEES CHAIR, JENNIE MARSHALL

NOVEMBER TRUSTEE UPDATE

There is never a good way to talk about bathrooms!

And for a number of years your Trustees have had to get to business evaluating our bathroom situation. At the time when Pastor Joe and Linda moved into the parsonage in 2019, the need to update the bathrooms had been identified, recognizing that the last time any refresh was done was during the 1980's.



In the last year, the St. Mark's Trustees identified the need to evaluate the spaces again, and sought the help of the congregation for a referral for a contractor. We received one referral, Gorgeous Living LLC., and they have been very supportive in evaluating the

bathrooms in both our church facility and the parsonage. Just like we do within our own homes, we had to consider what funds were available and what needed attention first, and asked for Anthony at Gorgeous Living and his team for their professional opinion on what bathroom was in the worst state. They came to the conclusion that the upstairs bathroom of the parsonage could be the first considered.

At this time, we have a quote for a complete tear out, drywall (replacing the current plaster) and upgrade of the upstairs bathroom that is aligned with previous estimates. Trustees are working with both the Finance Committee and Ad Council on the desire to move forward with the upgrade and want to share the before pictures with you, and we are hopeful to be able to share updated pictures as we consider moving forward!


