MESSAGE FROM PASTOR IOE

Dear St. Mark's Family,

Greetings to you in the name of our risen lord, Jesus Christ!

Easter has meant many things to me. When I was just a kid, Easter included coloring eggs, getting new shoes and clothes (because Mom wanted her kids to look good at church on Easter), finding candy in our baskets, and Dad taking pictures of us all lined up from shortest to tallest, before getting in the car to drive to church. Easter worship was not so fun for me as a kid. I loved our church, Walnut Street Methodist in Chillicothe. But, because there was no children's church on Easter, we kids had to sit still in the big wooden pews with the grownups and suffer through a long sermon. I remember my dad reaching over with his long arm in an attempt at keeping me from squirming too much.

When I reached adulthood, my understanding and feelings about Easter changed! I still enjoyed the candy and fun, but worship wasn't as bad as it was when I was a kid. It even became enjoyable. I loved singing the Easter hymns and I gradually came to know the meaning of Jesus' death and resurrection. Years in seminary brought on more depth of meaning, and my many years of being a pastor and leading worship further deepened my beliefs.

Finally, on April 21, 2019, my first Easter spent with you was one of the most enjoyable, most celebrative days of my life. I could hardly contain my joy. I remember shouting with you, "Christ is Risen!" and meaning it to my core.

But then, on the next day, we learned that our 27 year old son had died, which plunged my family and me into shock, despair, and deep darkness. In the days that followed, we became aware that Jon had been in such a state of deep depression that it eventually overwhelmed him. He was in such a state that he did not realize how devastating his death would be for his loved ones.

Up until this time, I thought I "got" Easter. I thought I understood its meaning for my life and yours. I was a pastor, for goodness' sake! But, Jon's death caused me to question everything I knew and understood about the Resurrection. I even wondered for a time if I would ever be able to celebrate Easter again, let alone lead worship.

I write this because on this coming Easter, I intend to share what I have learned since that dark time, and what Easter means to me now, and that even through grief, we can experience joy and abundance. I know that I am not the only one who has experienced darkness and pain and loss. So, I pray that my words will be acceptable to God, and will be a help to those listening. I covet your prayers as I prepare for this day, my last Easter spent with you.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON GROUP BIBLE STUDY 2-3PM



FINANCE COMMITTEE NEWS

GALE GOODMAN, FINANCE CHAIR BILL & LYNNE SCHUMACKER, CO-TREASURERS

Dear St. Mark's Family,



Galatians 6:2

Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. I hope everyone is enjoying more sunlight and the promise of warmer temperatures that are within our grasp. I, for one, am looking forward to the warm temps and longer days of sunshine. It is the time of the month where I report on the financial status of the Church. We ended February in a better position than what we ended January with. Our giving for the month totaled \$37,111; which brings our year-to-date amount received to \$62,295. Our expenses for February were somewhat lower in February than January. The February expenses were \$23,832. Therefore, we took in \$13,304 more than what we spent. Before you become too comfortable with that news, please remember we had a deficit in January where we spent more than what was received in giving. We hope that as the body of the Church, we can continue this trend of spending less than we take in.

The ending balances in the bank accounts totaled \$113,673. I want to remind you, as I do every month, that \$44,500 of that amount can only be used for improvements and repairs to the property of our Church campus. That amount is the \$51,500 from the proceeds of the sale of the empty lot less the first installment payment (\$7,000) for the bathroom remodel at the parsonage.

As was noted in last month's newsletter, the Finance Committee worked on and approved a budget that was sent to the Admin Board for approval. Because the amounts on the Commitment Cards fell short of what was anticipated, and we could not accurately pin down an estimated amount that could be anticipated from giving; the Admin Board voted on and passed a resolution to accept the Budget presented to them for the expenses only. Therefore, we will continue to review and monitor our dollars received against the dollars being spent.

It is the hope of the Finance Committee and the Admin Board that with spending being controlled, and receiving giving not anticipated that we will be able to fulfill the budget requests from the various committees and continue to pay our obligations as they come up. We, the Finance Committee, continue to thank you for your support of St. Mark's through your prayers and your gifts. As always, Bill Schumacker and I are available to address your questions, concerns, or comments. Please feel free to reach out to us.



WHAT WOULD YOU DO?

What would you do if during worship service, someone nearby has a seizure, passed out or is feeling faint?

Do you know what to do?

At the very least, please stand up and shout for help and for someone to call 911

Perhaps you could call out a name or point at someone willing to call 911?

Someone will need to stand outside and lead the ambulance to the person needing assistance.

Someone should <u>calmly</u> and <u>quickly</u> grab the Automated External Defibrillator (AED), which is clearly marked with a sign, in a white wall-mounted <u>box that is located in the Narthex hallway</u>, (between the seating area and bathroom).

Easy to follow instructions are inside the AED container. Once you attach the two probes (per the picture), the machine will determine heart function as well as determine if a shock is needed.

(If a shock is needed, everyone stand clear!)

Administering CPR is the last resort.

**Those not physically helping, please pray and know that "you are helping!"




