*Dear St. Mark's Family,*

Lent began on Ash Wednesday, February 22. Our 2023 Lenten Theme is "Lookin' for Love in all the Wrong Places" (remember the song?). This is a worship series developed by Marcia

McFee and adapted for our use here at St. Mark's.

**Marcia writes:** *People often look for wholeness and happiness in places that offer only temporary "good feelings" and satisfaction. But the Christian scriptures offer many images where love, grace, forgiveness, righteousness, and healing can REALLY be found. ### Troop 960 and St. Mark's UMC

The relationship of St. Mark's United Methodist Church with Boy Scout Troop 960 has changed. For the past several years, St. Mark's has served as Troop 960's Charter Organization. This relationship included providing overall supervision of the troop leaders and its operations; We also technically owned the equipment, bank account, etc. With the ongoing struggles in the national Boy Scouts of America--sexual misconduct, financial difficulties, and bankruptcy in 2020. The United Methodist Churches have been advised to discontinue this formal affiliation with scouting organizations.

**(It's important to know that our local Troop 960 has not had any trouble in this regard).**

Fortunately for Troop 960 Covenant Community Church is now serving as the Troop's Charter Organization.

In addition, to the relationship as described above, they will also host the Troop on Scout Sunday.

Since Covenant Community does not have the space accommodate the scouts and their equipment,

St. Mark's will continue to host Troop 960 under the terms of a Facilities Use Agreement made up jointly by the BSA and the United Methodist Church. St. Mark's will continue to welcome the Troop here for meetings and activities, and allow them to store their equipment and trailer here.

Our good relationship and partnership with Troop 960 will continue as before, at least informally; the main difference will be that we will no longer have overall responsibility for the Troop and will be released from any potential liability.

**St. Mark's wishes Troop 960 continued success in their mission of building leaders and citizens of the future.**

# FINANCE COMMITTEE NEWS

*Dear St. Mark's Family,*



**Proverbs 17:3**  
*The refining pot is for  
silver and the  
furnace for gold,  
But the Lord tests

Here is the status of where we ended January, 2023. The amount in our checking account at the end of the month was \$18,156; while the ending balance in the savings account was \$82,660. For a combined total of \$100,816. We need to keep in mind that \$51,500 in the savings account was from the sale of the empty lot. Those proceeds, as a reminder, can only be used for capital improvements to the property and the buildings that encompasses our St Mark's campus.

We received \$25,209 in giving in January, while our expenses were \$28,312. When doing the calculation, we spent \$3,103 more than we received. There were a couple of factors that enter into that result. We started the month on New Year's Day, and we had a snow event early on a Sunday morning. Both of those kept our attendance low, plus, we needed to pay for the snow removal. We did pay our monthly portion of the apportionments in the amount of \$2,846.

The Finance Committee has worked on and finally been able to achieve a budget for the current year. The Commitments we received from the Congregation, fell short of what was anticipated. Therefore, I have asked that the Committees that submitted their budgets to strive to tighten their spending and therefore spending less than what was requested on their budget submissions.

We want to make sure everyone is aware that we will strive to pay the needs of the Church. We will keep wages for our staff paid, we will keep the lights on, and we will constantly review our financial standing so that we can still be a visual and physical presence for the Lord. Even though we have paid the apportionments for January, we will pay future payments as we are able.

The Finance Committee wants to make sure that you know that we appreciated those of you who took time and prayerfully considered your anticipated financial gifts to the Church for 2023. We understand that the economy is difficult right now. We also understand that like you, all of us have had to adjust our household finances. As a Church, will weather this economic storm – for better or worse – we will survive.

In closing, please know that we have tightened the belt here at St Marks. We will continue to do what we must to make sure all of our obligations are met. In late summer of 2019, Pastor Joe cast a vision of creating a vegetable garden on our church property between the parsonage and garages, with the main goal of providing fresh vegetables for our local food pantries. In 2020, that garden became a reality. Last year, following a strategic planting of crops that gave an extended harvests (such as tomatoes, zucchini, cucumbers, peppers, etc.), with St. Mark's donating 1008 pounds to our local food pantries. The garden has been under Pastor Joe's leadership, with assistance from those who either volunteered or were "gently persuaded" to help. Gardening is not for everybody, for sure! However, others may know of its many benefits, or at least are willing to give it a try. What's needed to continue this ministry is a core group willing to give a little time during the growing season (sometimes a lot of time, especially at harvest when it's really fun!). Most helpful, would be a leader to oversee and take ownership of the operation. Pastor Joe has offered to help us get started this spring as an added incentive to continue the ministry when he departs. Every week during Lent, we will begin in worship with our families with a Children's Time and then we will all move together to Sunday School (on the 2nd, 3rd and 4th Sundays)



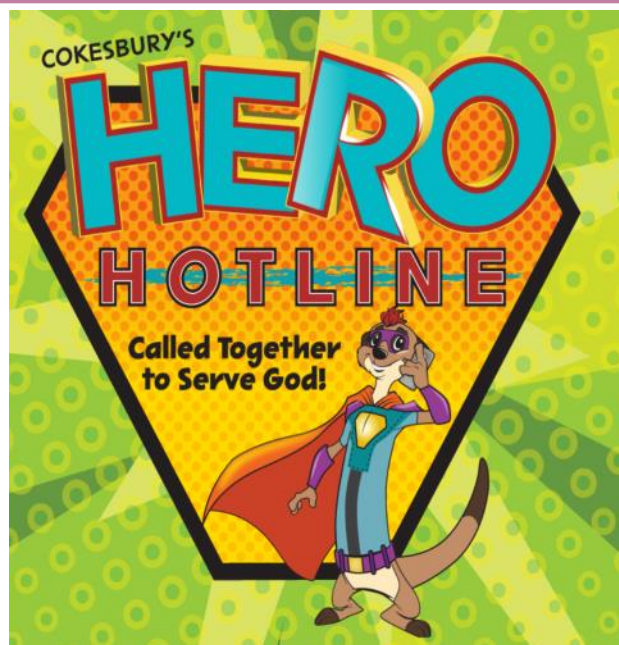
**BEGINNING MARCH 5**

## WHAT WOULD YOU DO?

What would you do if during worship service, someone nearby has a seizure, passed out or is feeling faint?

### *Do you know what to do?*

At the very least, please stand up and shout for help and for someone to call 911

Perhaps you could call out a name or point at someone willing to call 911?

Someone will need to stand outside and lead the ambulance to the person needing assistance.

Someone should calmly and quickly grab the Automated External Defibrillator (AED), which is clearly marked with a sign, in a white wall-mounted box that is located in the Narthex hallway, (between the seating area and bathroom).

Easy to follow instructions are inside the AED container. Once you attach the two probes (*per the picture*), the machine will determine heart function as well as determine if a shock is needed.

(If a shock is needed, everyone stand clear!)

**Administering CPR is the last resort.**

\*\*Those not physically helping, please pray and know that "you are helping!"
