It is one of my favorite spiritual disciplines and a practice I wanted to leave with these youth. They were each given a journal to support them in this practice.









Later in the month, we had our Fun Night Out! Pastor Joe joined us as we played putt-putt golf and then shared a meal at one of our favorite places to eat—Cane's! The next day we held a Bake Sale at church to raise funds for mental health and suicide awareness. We are so grateful to each and every person who donated goodies to our sale! We had four tables full of sweets! We raised close to \$400! Half will be donated to the Fairfield High School Hope Squad, a student organization that supports peer-to-peer suicide prevention.

The other half will be given to the Butler County Community Health Alliance to assist their 988 Initiative, a lifeline chat and text service connecting persons with crisis counselors.






We had 14 members of our St. Mark's congregation who enjoyed an afternoon at Shared Harvest packing a variety of boxes for local pantries.



I hope this finds everyone doing well and bouncing back from seasonal allergies. I know we pay the price for living in the Ohio Valley area, but it is great to watch the trees bud and fill in with green leaves as well as all of the beautiful flowers coming back.

I want to take a few lines to give you the finance information for April that just ended. The ending balances in the back account totaled \$115,616. we have been able to meet all of our financial obligations this month for payroll, the loan at the bank, and general expenditures to run the Church. The balance of our loan is down to \$35,905.

In previous newsletters, you may have noticed information about **CPR Training** available at the local Fire Dept. It would be helpful to know those in the congregation, who have completed the training or who are already CPR certified. Please indicate on the back of the attendance sheet or call the church office to let us know you are certified. We pray that we never need to call on you, but knowing who is CPR trained offers us some reassurances.

WHAT WOULD YOU DO?

What would you do if during worship service, someone nearby has a seizure, passed out or is feeling faint?

Do you know what to do?

At the very least, please stand up and shout for help and for someone to call 911. Perhaps you could call out a name or point at someone willing to call 911?

Someone will need to stand outside and lead the ambulance to

the person needing assistance.

Someone should <u>calmly</u> and <u>quickly</u> grab the Automated External Defibrillator (AED), which is clearly marked with a sign, in a white wall-mounted <u>box that is located in the Narthex hallway</u>, (between the seating area and bathroom in the hallways).



Easy to follow instructions are inside the AED container. Once you attach the two probes (*per the picture*), the machine will determine heart function as well as determine if a shock is needed.

(If a shock is needed, everyone stand clear!)


Administering CPR is the last resort.

The Fairfield Fire Department provides free CPR and AED training.


