<u>Dear St. Mark's Family,</u>

Here we are again. Spring has come back around, the days are getting longer and warmer, and the mornings are full of the sounds of the birds chirping. I love spring mornings. *Jo me, they hold a promise of a new beginning – something to look forward to.* 



It is with a sense of gratitude that I report, we had the best March with regards to Giving Received in several years. That coupled with a strong February, gives us a year-to-date Giving Amount at \$92,581. Year-to-date spending shows our expenses at \$80,908.87. Which with the help of everyone, we have been able to pay all our expenses, the loan, and we have been able to pay some apportionments.

The ending balances in the bank accounts totaled \$116,233. Here is the monthly reminder, we all need to remember that \$44,150 of that amount can only be used for improvements and repairs to the property of our Church campus.

I think it is only fair to mention that the recent bout with Covid that has hit us in April has taken a toll on our attendance and on us financially. Please keep in mind that even though many of us could not attend worship, the expenses of the Church have continued. April is proving to be a challenge. With the strong beginning of the year, Bill is managing the outflow of bills; and right now we are in a good position.

I hope that soon, we will have this round of Covid behind us and we can once again all be together in worship and fellowship. As always, the Finance Committee thanks you for your support of St. Mark's through your gifts and prayers. Please know that Bill Schumacker and I are available if you have any questions or comments about our financial position here at St. Mark's. If we cannot answer your question on the spot, we will get an answer for you. Please feel free to reach out to us.

What will we work on during All Church workdays?

Is there an area that needs attention or items you've noticed? **Helping Hands** is an ongoing effort focused not only on identifying those who can spend time working on areas in and around the church with minor updates, clean ups or necessary tasks, but also to identify the areas needing attention. It would be helpful to know those in the congregation, who have completed the training or who are already CPR certified. Please indicate on the back of the attendance sheet or call the church office to let us know you are certified. ## WHAT WOULD YOU DO?

What would you do if during worship service, someone nearby has a seizure, passed out or is feeling faint?

## Do you know what to do?

At the very least, please stand up and shout for help and for someone to call 911. Perhaps you could call out a name or point at someone willing to call 911? Someone will need to stand outside and lead the ambulance to the person needing assistance.



Someone should <u>calmly</u> and <u>quickly</u> grab the Automated External Defibrillator (AED), which is clearly marked with a sign, in a white wall-mounted <u>box that is located in the</u> <u>Narthex hallway</u>, (between the seating area and bathroom in the hallways).

Easy to follow instructions are inside the AED container. Once you attach the two probes (*per the picture*), the machine will determine heart function as well as determine if a shock is needed. (If a shock is needed, everyone stand clear!) <u>Administering CPR is the last resort</u>. \*\*Those not physically helping, please pray and know that "you are helping!"

The Fairfield Fire Department provides free CPR and AED training. Call (513) 867-5379 for more information.
