YOU PAUSED YOUR CAREER FOR ME — GHANAIAN PROFESSOR EULOGIZES WIFE

A Ghanaian Professor at the Northern Kentucky University, Faculty of Informatics, Professor Tony Tsetse has in a very emotional and heartwarming message described his wife as a woman whose kind is yet to be born. Prof. Tony Tsetse, an alumina of Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology, KNUST, Kumasi revealed that, his wife Evelyn Mawuenya Tsetse at a point in time when their relationship was at an infant stage had to pause her career so he could pursue his career something he does not take it lightly.



Tony and Evelyn met when they were both students. On 14th June, 2003, the traditional marriage was performed to the admiration of family members and friends in Ghana considering the short spine of the relationship at the time after which Tony traveled to Denmark to further his education.

Shortly after that, on November 20, 2003, at the International Christian Community Church in Copenhagen, Denmark, the white wedding was performed regardless of the difficulties he was going

through as an international student. Twenty years down the line, the couple with three beautiful kids, Marvin, Mirabel and...decided to renew their vows in a simple but classy and exquisite ceremony at First Baptist Church, Cold Spring, Kentucky, USA.

The 20th anniversary vow renewal ceremony which was capped with a dinner was attended by family members, colleagues in the academia, friends, classmates and church members with some coming from Ghana, UK and other parts of the United States. The Head Pastor of New Covenant United Methodist Church in Cincinnati Ohio, Pastor Ernest Padi Ologo who officiated the ceremony was enthused about the success story of the couple. He admonished them to be worthy ambassadors of Christ through their marriage.

When the jovial young Professor of international repute was given the opportunity to reaffirm his love or otherwise to his smashing High school looking like Evelyn in her all white wedding gown, Professor Tony Tsetse demonstrated his teaching skills by carefully crafting words to suit the occasion and to melt his wife's heart...

"My dearest Evelyn, I can't believe it is already 20years. We started this as kids not knowing exactly what we were getting ourselves into. 

FINANCIAL UPDATE

GALE GOODMAN, FINANCE COMMITTEE CHAIR BILL AND LYNNE SCHUMACKER, CO-TREASURERS

Dear St. Mark's Family,

Here we are into October already! It is hard to believe that fall is upon us and summer has slipped away.

Recently, Bill and I spoke to the Congregation during worship. We noted that the giving has been low since April. We are covering the operating expenses; however, we are cutting into the financial reserves that we have to cover those expenses.



As was mentioned, several factors have contributed to this short fall. The covid outbreak in April that several affected attendance, the transition of a new pastor to our church, and the cost of living that has increased in the last several months. I noted above that the operating expenses to run the church have been kept current. Those operating expenses include the following: salaries for the staff, the utility bills for the church, general cleaning and maintenance of the building, and the loan we have at Park National. We have made payments for the apportionments that are due to the District Conference. Please keep in mind St. Mark's portion of the apportionments increased to \$34,157 for 2023. To date, we have been able to pay \$12,154. Which equates to a balance due of \$22,003. We want you to know that when we do have the funds, we have been sending payments in against the balance due for the apportionments.

Ruth and Cheryl will be preparing the giving statements through the end of September and those will be mailed out to you sometime in October. Please take time to review your statement when you receive it. There were several errors found in the electronic upload of data from the online giving portal to the software we have here at St Mark's. Those errors were investigated and all of them have been corrected. So, we are asking that your take a few minutes, review the statements. If you do find an error, please contact Ruth Ritenbaugh or Cheryl Creach. They are the only two who can research and correct any errors. No one on the church staff or the finance committee has access to the giving records.

We are hopeful that giving will start to rebound and we will be able to finish the year on a more solid note. Please know that we are doing everything we can to make sure that St Mark's continues to operate smoothly. We appreciate any help that you can give us to make that commitment a realty. We are confident that the Congregation will pull together to make a positive end to the year we know as 2023.

As always, Bill and I are available for questions or comments regarding the financial status of St. Mark's. We will be happy to address any concerns that you have. Please reach out to us.




WEEKLY STUDY GROUP GATHERINGS


