MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MARK

"ON YOUR MARK..."

Some things just sneak up on you. One of those things is Advent. We gather for Thanksgiving and enjoy the fun times of the holiday, and just waiting behind the corner is Advent. There is some irony to the fact that a season of preparation is often the time we are least prepared.

Advent is a time of preparation,

however not for Christmas per say. Advent is a time we prepare for Jesus. Just as He came in history and fulfilled the Word of God, so He will come again just as He promised. It is a time we call ourselves to be ready to meet Jesus. Not just on Christmas morning, but in the many ways we can receive Christ in each day.



For the last several years I have done something different in worship for Advent. I have focused on one of the players in the Advent story. It is easy to rush the season and lose the significance of the story. This Advent season I will be preaching on Joseph. Joseph is one of the most important people in the Advent story. He was the guy God spoke to as well as to work out the logistics of the birth of the Christ Child. As important as Joseph is in the story, he says nothing. There are no recorded words of Joseph in the Scriptures. He is a man put into a challenging situation who has to live out his faithfulness in actions and not words. Join us this Advent season as we journey with Joseph through Advent.



As we think about Advent, it is important to have this programing note:

Christmas Eve is on a Sunday this year, and that creates some challenges in worship planning. This year we will have two services on Christmas Eve: One will be our normal 9:30 AM service and it will incorporate some of the events of our evening family service. We also have our traditional 11:00 PM Candlelight Service.



I encourage you to join us this Advent season and on Christmas Eve as we celebrate the season and the arrival of Christ in history and our lives.

DIRECTOR OF MUSIC CHRIS BEISER




We are heading quickly into that time year when there are all sorts of friends and family gatherings for the holidays.

I wanted to make sure


I wanted to make sure you had some wonderful music opportunities marked on your calendars before things get too crazy!

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Dear St. Mark's Family,

With cooler fall days upon us, year-end is quickly approaching. So, I thought I would take this time to discuss some current issues and go over some year-end information with you.

As has been noted in the recent newsletters, this year has been a challenge. Just like in your immediate families, we have and are facing these challenges together. Bill Schumacher has come up with an aggressive plan to address our apportionments that are still outstanding. He has recently sent a \$3000 payment to Conference to go towards our apportionments. He plans on doing this in November and December. If we, as a Church, can do this: we will still owe \$10,000 for 2023. After talking with Pastor Mark and Bill, we have come up with the following proposal and challenge to you. There are nine Sundays remaining for November and December. If everyone can give an extra \$10 per week for nine weeks, we will have enough to cover our weekly expenses as well as finish paying the outstanding balance of \$10K for our apportionments. For the past several years, St Mark's has been able to pay 100% of our apportionments. We are hoping to have that trend continue with your help.

We ended September with \$25,154 in the Checking Account. Please note, that this is a decrease from \$41,179 earlier this year. There is now \$70,575 in the Savings Account which is down from \$89,660 earlier this year. The reasons are simple for the decline in both accounts. We have had increased expenditures and the costs for daily operations of the Church has increased. We have also experienced a decrease in giving from the Congregation. Please keep in mind that we can only use \$25,000 in the Savings Account for operating the Church. The remaining balance of the savings account can only be used for capital improvements to the St Mark's campus. Our loan at Park National Bank is now down to \$31,631.


It is important to point out that all payments have been made on time and the loan is current. Bill has been able to keep all the operating expenses paid.

Now that November is here, we have started to turn our attention to the new year and the budget for next year. We are asking all the committees and departments here at the Church to take a good look at what was spent this year, and try to reduce spending on their budget requests for 2024. We are hopeful with everyone reducing the amount that is being requested, we will be in a better position next year where apportionments and expenses can easily be paid without an extra plea to the Congregation.

Since year-end is just around the corner, I wanted to make sure everyone understands how year-end giving needs to be received and recorded. We, in the finance area of St Mark's, had some issues last year-end with giving at the end of December. So together, we have decided on the following to mirror what is required by IRS regulations. All year-end electronic gifts must be received by the St Mark's bank by Friday, December 29, 2023. The last date to give a gift to St Mark's in person will be Sunday, December 31, 2023, by the end of worship. If you plan on mailing a year-end gift to the Church, please mail in time to be received by St Mark's on Saturday, December 30, 2023. Any gifts received after the end of worship on 12/31/2023, will be received and recorded as 2024 giving. We are hopeful that by having a definitive plan for year-end, things will be easier for everyone.

I appreciate your taking time to read this rather lengthy, fact-filled message. We are hopeful that with your help, we will be able to end the year successfully. Therefore, sending us into 2024 with a good foothold for a great beginning. As always, if you have any questions regarding the finances of St Mark's, please ask. Bill and I will be happy to provide the answers to your questions.





IT'S THE SEASON OF GIVING THANKS!

I'm thankful for St. Mark's and our faith family and am looking forward to the fall leaves and pumpkin pie!

Your St. Mark's Trustees are preparing for cooler weather! We've recently updated heating/air units and moved a unit around to ensure we have working units in the rooms and offices; heating/cooling. We continue to work with the vendor on updating the software for our building access and by the time you read this, the work will have started by repairing the Boy Scouts Garage.

We also continue to have All Church Workdays, "Helping Hands" into the fall to ensure our lawn and grounds are ready for colder weather. As part of our clean up, we've cleaned up the courtyard in hopes to have the space used more. If you have an idea on additional uses for our courtyard we welcome your suggestions, please see any trustee with your ideas!

COLUMBARIUM

So what is a columbarium? A columbarium is a structure or niche to hold cremated ashes of the dead. A columbarium can be installed inside or outside a building. If outside, the columbarium can be fenced in. A single columbarium will hold 24 individual urns with names and dates inscribed on each unit, (see image example). The United Methodist Church in Milford has a

columbarium.

The units can be purchased at the time of a death or some choose to purchase a unit years before there is a need. The cost of a unit is significantly lower than a cemetery plot.
