

FINANCIAL UPDATE

GALE GOODMAN, FINANCE COMMITTEE CHAIR BILL AND LYNNE SCHUMACKER, CO-TREASURERS

Dear St. Mark's Family,

MERRY CHRISTMAS! It is hard to believe that Christmas is upon us. HAPPY NEW YEAR! It is even harder to believe that 2023 is nearly over.

First and foremost, let me thank everyone who has been able to respond to our challenge to help with a little extra to get us closer to paying the apportionments and yearend expenses. We are still hopeful that we will be able to obtain our goal of paying 100% of our 2023 apportionments. With that in mind, we still have a little more work to do to get there. We want to thank Pam Brockfield for bringing us the good news that our apportionments will not be increasing in 2024. This is good news going into setting the budget for 2024.

We ended October with \$30,691 in the checking account. While we ended with \$70,575 in our savings account. Please keep in mind that we can only use \$25,000 in the Savings Account for operating the Church. The remaining balance of the savings account can only be used for capital improvements to the St Mark's campus. I think it is important to mention that recently we have had some repairs to the roof and various HVAC issues that had to be addressed. Even though those expenditures had to do with the building, they were repairs and not considered improvements. Meaning those had to be paid out of the General Fund and not the amount set aside for capital improvements.



Our loan at Park National Bank is now down to \$30,908. All payments are current and have been paid on a timely basis.

I know we included this next piece of information in the last newsletter, but I thought it was worth repeating in the event someone may have missed it in November. "Since year-end is just around the corner, I wanted to make sure everyone understands how year-end giving needs to be

received and recorded. We, in the finance area of St Mark's, had some issues last year-end with giving at the end of December. So together, we have decided on the following to mirror what is required by IRS regulations. All year-end electronic gifts must be received by the St Mark's bank by Friday, December 29, 2023. The last date to give a gift to St Mark's in person will be Sunday, December 31, 2023, by the end of worship. If you plan on mailing a year-end gift to the Church, please mail in time to be received by St Mark's on Saturday, December 30, 2023. Any gifts received after the end of worship on 12/31/2023, will be received and recorded as 2024 giving. We are hopeful that by having a definitive plan for year-end, things will be easier for everyone."



Now that new committee members have been announced, I want to take a few lines and Thank Bob Pittman and Don Menke for their service on the Finance Committee. We have appreciated their thoughts, comments, and suggestions.

I hope everyone has had an opportunity to see the "RECORD OF FAITHFULNESS" in the weekly bulletin. Make sure you glace at it each week to see how we are doing. As always, if you have any questions regarding the finances of St Mark's, please ask. Bill and I will be happy to provide the answers to your questions.

TRUSTEES CORNER AND CONFERENCE REPORT

LETTER FROM THE TRUSTEES CHAIR, JENNIE MARSHALL

THE ADVENT SEASON is a season of preparation for the celebration of the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. As a youth growing up in our church, I have fond memories of how we've prepared and celebrated over

the years. This time of year also reminds me of family. My mother and grandmother very much loved all the hustle and bustle of the season and some of their traditions became my own. My Christmas decorations come



out on the first Sunday of Advent and are taken down on Epiphany, like clockwork and how Ruby Kemp did.

This year, I am reflecting on my time as your Trustee chair and thank my fellow trustees past and present for entrusting me to manage and care for our church and grounds. My prayer is that this congregation continues to lift up your 2024 trustees and chair in prayer, and offer your helping hands when possible, to keep our church beautiful.

During December, we know everyone is busy but hope you can spend a few hours on <u>Saturday, December 2 at 9am</u> to ensure the inside of church is picked up, wiped down, and small projects (WD-40 doors, clean windows and/or replace lights where needed).



Marlis Hatten will be your Trustee point of contact for our final Helping Hands of 2023. If you see or know of areas needing attention please note on the back of the Sunday Attendance sheet.

And my final plug, please consider when at the church; our thermostats (nursery, fellowship hall and our sanctuary) are programmable and preset for the current season. If they are changed at any time from the programmed temperature, they should be set back after the area's use. Additionally, everyone can check for lights left on, if you turn a light on, turn it off after use or if you see a light that can be turned off, please do so.

SPECIAL SESSION ANNUAL CONFERENCE REPORT!

The West Ohio Annual Conference Special Session was held on 10/28/23 at Ginghamsburg UMC in Tipp City, OH. Bishop Gregory Palmer presided over the conference with nearly 800 clergy and lay members in attendance. *The day began with a worship service.* Rev. Dr. Tim Bias, Olentangy River District Superintendent presented the sermon. His message, "When you leave this place, you will be entering the mission field where people need hope. Don't give up, keep going!"

There was Conference business to be handled:

—96 churches in our conference requested disaffiliation from The United Methodist Church. This was supported by the conference members.

—A report on the Strategic Plan for the West Ohio Conference. *The focus areas for the next three years are:* Strengthen the ministry pipeline, develop an approach to engage younger populations, and to Revise, Prioritize, and Align conference resources to focus on helping churches be missional.

Legislation:

The budget was postponed from June in order to deal with the result of disaffiliating churches. The recommendation for the budget was affirmed. Some of the highlights were:

- —The probability of sharing a Bishop with the East Ohio Conference effective September 1, 2024.
- —Strategic use of funds from closed churches to support new churches and emerging ministries and invest in the same purpose via endowment.
- —No increase in apportionments for next year. We are a congregation that pays our apportionments in full. Refer to the November Newsletter from Gale Goodman and the Schumacker's regarding paying our apportionments. It's a simple way that we continue to support our church.
- —The disposition of West Ohio Camps and Retreat Ministry Property: Due to declining enrollment and increasing costs and maintenance, the recommendation was to sell Camp Widewater and Camp Otterbein, but to keep Camp Wesley. The proceeds from the sale are restricted for current and future camping and retreat ministries for children, youth and young adult ministries. The recommendation passed.

The 2020 General Conference and the Jurisdiction Conference will be held in 2024. The delegates elected at that time will be the ones attending. It was necessary to elect additional delegates due to some people not being able to serve.

The 2024 West Ohio Annual Conference will be held on May 29 to June 1, 2024 at Capital University in Bexley, OH with theme, "God is Able"
