MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MARK


"A Serious Moment..."

FINANCIAL UPDATE

GALE GOODMAN, FINANCE COMMITTEE CHAIR BILL SCHUMACKER, TREASURER

Dear St Mark's Family,



Well February is here. That can only mean that Pitchers and Catchers will be reporting to Spring Training. For me, that signals Spring is not far away.

First and foremost, we want to update the Congregation that due to your generous efforts during November and December, we were able to pay our apportionments in full by the end of December. So once again, St. Mark's continues its consistent ability to pay the apportionments. We have started to nip away at this year's apportionments. Which unfortunately for us, did increase a bit. The percentages that the apportionments were based on did not change from 2023, however, due to our operating expenses increasing, etc. our basis for determining the apportionments increased.

In 2023, we paid \$34,154 for apportionments; in 2024 we will be paying \$35,354. That represents an increase of \$1200. For the present, we want to thank you for your support in rising to help us take care of the apportionments.

We are all due a pat on the back for that!



In December, we ended the year with \$105,473 in the bank accounts for St Mark's. There is \$41,029 in the checking for paying the expenses of the Church; while \$64,444 is in the savings account. As I always point out, only \$25,024 can be used for general expenses of the Church – with \$39,420 only being used for improvements to the buildings and

properties of St. Mark's. Our loan at Park National Bank stands at \$29,459. All payments have been made on time and are current.



By now, you should have received your Annual Giving Statements. Please make sure you take a few minutes and review it when you receive it. Ruth and Cheryl will need to know as soon as possible if there are any issues that you might find with your statement. The sooner that those issues are discovered, the sooner they can be resolved. Also remember, they are the only ones who have access to your giving accounts.

Please contact them directly or leave a message at the Church for them to contact you.

The Finance Committee is now working on the budget for 2024. We hope to have the budget to the Admin Board at that next meeting. As always, if you have questions regarding the financial status of St Mark's, feel free to contact Bill or myself. We will be happy to address any of your concerns.


