




In a world so broken and divided, filled with wars, greedy, misinformation and hate... Easter is a moment to pause and understand that God in

* Cantatas are an event for the church. They bring in people that may not come to a regular worship service and they build excitement and a positive feeling into the service.

* Cantatas offer a different way to tell a biblical story that can leave a real impact on the listener.



* Cantatas gives the choir time to present a message of strong context in a worship service. It allows the choir to weave together music and narrative, so that the impact of the presentation is increased. * A Cantata is an event that can get people to attend our church that often don't come. Many times, someone comes to see a friend or family member. It allows time for churchgoers to invite other people to attend the program.


* A Cantata allows for wider group involvement, so you not only have the choir, but you have instrumentalists and narrators, sometimes a set and costumes. Cantatas get many ages involved.



* Cantatas provide memories. If you ask a church member what anthem was sung last Sunday, they probably don't remember but ask them what Cantata was sung a year ago or even several years and they'll be able to tell you about it immediately.

So bottom line, a Cantata, prepared and carefully performed, can create a lasting, and sometimes lifechanging impact on those who experience them.

FINANCIAL AND TRUSTEES UPDATES

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Dear St Mark's Family,

It is hard to believe that the Season of Lent is upon us. We hope that this season will give you an opportunity to pause and reflect on the last year since Easter, 2023.

We finished January with \$40,958 in the checking account. We have \$64,453 in the savings account. With \$39,420 being held for property improvements here at St Mark's, we have \$25,033 remaining that can be transferred into the checking account for general expenses if needed. Our loan at Park National Bank stands at \$28,732. All payments have been made on time and are current.



We have started making monthly payments towards our apportionments for 2024. Our apportionments increased this year by \$1200. The total balance due is \$35,357. Our plan is to make payments every month in the amount of \$2,946.42.

With the assistance of the various Committees and Ministries here at St. Mark's, we have been able to set a budget for the new year. With your continued support through your gifts and prayers, we hope to stay on track and finish the year strong.


