FINANCIAL AND TRUSTEES UPDATES

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Dear St Mark's Family,

We trust that everyone had a wonderful Easter this year. Hard to believe that Easter is now behind us for another year. We finished February with \$33,500 in the checking account which is down \$7,458 from January. We have \$64,453 in the savings account. With \$39,420 being held for property improvements here at St. Mark's, we have \$25,033 remaining that can be transferred into the checking account for general expenses, if needed. Our loan at Park National Bank stands at \$28,003. All payments have been made on time and are current.

Currently, \$5,893 has been paid of the \$35,357 due for apportionments. We have been able to stay with our plan to pay \$2,946.42 towards that balance every month.



As noted above, our checking balance is down. After reviewing the "Budgeted numbers" to the "Actual numbers," we are spending less than what we anticipated. We appreciate all of the committees and ministries here at St. Mark's helping to keep our expenses inline. Where we are falling short is the amount that is being received through the giving of the congregation. We will go into more detail next month after we have had a full quarter-of -the- year to report on

As always, if you have questions regarding the financial status of St. Mark's, feel free to contact Bill or myself. We will be happy to address any of your concerns.




