MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MARK

"Confessions of a Weather Geek: Embracing the Stormy Side of Spring"

Spring is upon us, and it is time when many of us think about baseball, flowers, birds, and warmth. Me? I think about something else. I will confess that I am a certified weather geek. I have 14 weather apps on my phone. I am also a certified storm spotter. I love weather, all types. So for me, as you think of flowers in the spring, I think of tornadoes.



I remember in the fall of 2013, I was up close and personal with a tornado (EF-2 for any fellow weather geeks). I was standing outside watching for a tornado that was coming our way. I should know better, but you know how that goes. I was maybe 150 yards from the tornado, and in that moment, I noticed a few things. Tornadoes up close don't look like tornadoes. It is a mass, a wall of swirling green. You are also struck by the power; it is massive and consuming, and something you are not prepared to experience. A tornado is the most violent storm that exists on earth, and witnessing its power personally leaves one with a profound sense of awe.



We stand in awe of God and God's power. Funny thing is, we tend to think of awe in easy terms. We are amazed, or we wonder. That is a part of "awe"; however, when you truly experience "awe," you are struck by elements of it that you did not understand. In the Old Testament, the Hebrew word for "awe" is most closely related to fear.

We have the Proverb, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom" (Proverbs 9:10). In a modern sense, we bristle at that Proverb. We love God and fear is not a part of that. And the Bible says "Perfect love casts out all fear..." (John 4:18) In our relationship with God, we no longer fear punishment for our sin, yes...However, when we stand before the power of God, there is still awe, and there is still fear. Not being afraid of God, but being overwhelmed by the power displayed in who God is.

Frankly, seeing the power of God displayed should give us pause and should inspire some holy fear. That's a good thing.



We often make God too small, too much like us. Take a step back and imagine and experience the power of God in creation and in your life. Let God be God. Yes, sometimes that is scary, but scary in a good and powerful way.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Shining Through the Summer: Navigating Stewardship at St. Mark's



Dear St Mark's Family,

I trust everyone survived the solar eclipse. It was quite an amazing wonder to witness. I hope everyone had an opportunity to witness it.

March ended with us having \$41,459 in the checking account while we have \$64,461 in the savings account. I will always point out that \$39,420 in the savings account can only be used for property improvements on the St Mark's campus with \$25,041 being available for general expenses, if needed. Currently, \$27,266 is the remaining balance to be paid on the Park National Loan.

As noted in last month's newsletter, I would like to update you on the financial status of St Mark's through the end of first quarter. For the first three months of 2024, we have received \$81,470 in gifts to the church, while we had budgeted \$94,288 for the same period. This budget number was based on what historically is given to the church during the same period in previous years. This represents a \$12,818 deficit from what we had budgeted.

We (the Finance Committee) had asked all of the committees and departments here at St. Mark's to be very conservative with their budget requests for 2024. We also requested that expenses be controlled as much as possible. Those requests were heard and have been acted upon. For the first quarter of 2024, we had budgeted \$85,401 in expenses to be paid. At this point, I am happy to report that the actual expenses for the first quarter of 2024 were kept to \$80,678. Therefore, we spent \$4,723 less than what we budgeted for.

You may ask, why is this important information? Well, coupled with the surplus from the end of 2023 and the controlled spending for the first quarter, we were able to weather the \$12,818 deficit in giving. With the actual giving in the first quarter of \$81,570 and the expenses paid of \$80,678, we spent less than what we received which is a good thing.

I do want to caution everyone with the first quarter results. The summer months are coming. The giving

usually dips during that time with weekend get-aways and vacations. We need to remain vigilant in our giving and in our spending. The surplus from the end of 2023 will quickly be absorbed into 2024 spending; therefore, we will not have that to rely on going into the summer months. Note, all of our expenses, payroll obligations, apportionments, and the loan are being paid up- to-date and on time.



Your gifts to St Mark's as well as all the diligent work that is being done to benefit St Mark's financial position, is greatly appreciated by everyone. We ask for your continued support through your prayers and gifts. As always, if you have questions regarding the financial status of St. Mark's, feel free to contact Bill or myself. We will be happy to address any of your concerns.





Join us for an exciting adventure with God at this year's Vacation Bible School, 'Camp Firelight', inspired by Psalm 56:3!


