


Additionally, every mom and woman received a single carnation as a token of appreciation. Thank you to everyone who participated and brought their fabulous hats to church!

# **FINANCIAL UPDATES and ST. MARK'S CARES MINISTRY**

### Breezy Budgeting: St. Mark's Financial Recap

Dear St. Mark's Family,

Here we are at the very beginning of the summer months. I hope everyone will take advantage of the sunshine and the cool evening breezes. The month of April ended quietly. With St. Mark's having \$48,213.46 in the checking account and \$64,461 in the savings account with \$39,420 was set aside in the savings account for improvements on the St. Mark's campus. That leaves \$25,041 to be used for general expense purposes, if needed.



The Park National Bank Loan stands at \$26,532. All payments have been made on a timely basis, and the loan is current. The giving for the month of April fell \$4,363 short of what we had budgeted. Luckily, our expenses that were paid out also were less than what we had budgeted by \$1,318. By spending less this month, that helped us out overall. We are still spending less than what we are receiving through giving. Thank you to all who are being very vigilant with their spending. Please note that all bills and apportionments continue to be paid on a timely basis. Bill has been able to stay with the plan of paying \$2,946.42 each month towards our apportionments to Conference. If we can stay on track, we will have the total of \$35,357 paid by year's end.



As I mentioned last month in the newsletter, we are coming up to the summer months. Giving usually decreases during the summer. We are hoping that everyone will be mindful that the expenses of the church continue to need to be paid even though it is vacation season. The Finance Committee would like to thank everyone for the gifts that have been given to St. Mark's, thus far, and we are thankful for the gifts that will be coming.

As always, if you have questions regarding the financial status of St. Mark's, feel free to contact Bill or myself. We will be happy to address any of your concerns.

We donated \$1,295.55 to the victims of Hawaii UMCOR Sunday donations totaled \$1,307.00




