



FINANCIAL AND TRUSTEES UPDATES

Summer Stewardship: St. Mark's Financial Outlook

Dear St Mark's Family,

August is here and that means temperatures are getting warmer and summer is winding down for the school aged members of our congregation.

With that being said, let us jump into the month end numbers for June. St Mark's ended the month of June showing \$57,951 in the checking account while the savings account ended the month with \$64,469. Always keep in mind that \$39,420 of the savings can only be used for improvements to the St. Mark's campus. Our loan at Park National is now down to \$25,056. All payments are current and paid on time.



As you may recall, giving to St Mark's fell during the month of May. However, it did rebound in June. St Mark's received \$35,527 in giving during the month of June. Please keep in mind that the expenses for VBS and the Annual Conference are still being processed in July. So, we will have a better picture of the full impact that those expenses once they have all been paid. We have continued to pay our apportionments each month. At this point, we are on track to have them taken care of during the month of December.

We appreciate your continued support of St Mark's through your gifts and prayers. Please feel free to contact us with any questions or comments you may have regarding the finances of St Mark's.
