MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MARK

Finding Hope in the Drought: A Call to Faith and Renewal

Over the years I have lived in a few farming communities. Rain was important. Often the topic of conversation on a Sunday morning was how many inches of rain they had received during the previous rain showers during the week. Rain was life, it was their livelihoods. I remember one such summer in 1999 when a drought was in full force. I talked with a few of the farmers, and they said that they could go for one year, if it hit two years in a row it would be an issue. Living in a more urban environment I think of the farmers in dry times, because it means so much more than just a brown yard to them.



Prayers for rain are a common prayer for the people of God. We can see in the witness of the Scriptures times when the rains stopped, droughts persisted, and the people suffered. We see people crying out to God for relief, for the life that comes from the rains. In desperate times they turned to God.



As we look around outside, we see what no rain means, as our yards wither and our gardens suffer. After a while we begin to worry, to become anxious about the outcomes. It is often a metaphor for our lives. Spiritually, we can feel as if we are in a drought. Things are dry, lifeless, even dead. It persists and seems there is no end. Like the timeless story in history, we cry out to God for relief and for the rains to bring us life again.



Like all droughts, this one will come to an end, the rains will return, and life will spring forth. If you find yourself in a spiritual drought, this too will end. The rains will return, and new life will spring forth. We keep our faith and know that God will be faithful in the end. Till then we join in the timeless prayer for the rain...God Bless.

FINANCIAL AND TRUSTEES UPDATES

AUTUMN FINANCIAL UPDATE: Preparing for Year-End

Happy Fall, Everyone! It seems like we just celebrated the 4th of July and here we are in October. The Holiday Season is just around the corner. Year-end will be coming before we know it.

Here's the latest financial update for St. Mark's through August 31, 2024. Our checking account has \$45,695, while the savings account holds \$64,469, with \$39,420 earmarked for St. Mark's Campus Improvements. We ended August with a deficit of \$3,408, and our loan balance at Park National Bank is \$23,566, with all payments current. We've paid \$26,751 of our \$35,357 apportionments for this year.

Keep an eye out for your YTD September 30th "Giving Statements," which will be mailed out in October by Ruth Ritenbaugh and Cheryl Creach. Please review them carefully. If you notice any discrepancies, contact Ruth or Cheryl directly, as they are the only ones that have access to the giving records. If you phone the church office, please leave a message for them to return your call. They will be able to correct any issues to the statements after reviewing.

These statements will also help you plan your year-end giving to St. Mark's as we look ahead to 2025. Speaking of year-end, this is the schedule for us receiving any gifts at the end of the calendar year.

LAST DATES to give a gift is as follows:



*In-Person Gifts: Last day to drop off gifts outside of worship is Friday, December 27, 2024.



*Mail Gifts: Must be postmarked by Saturday, December 28, 2024.



*Worship Gifts: Last day to give during worship is Sunday, December 29, 2024.

We'll remind everyone of these dates in the December newsletter and bulletins. Year-end comes quickly, so we want to ensure your gifts are processed and recorded for this year for our statements.
