MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MARK


Grateful Hearts, Ho-Ho Overload, and What's Coming Up...

FINANCIAL & TRUSTEES UPDATES

YOUR GIVING STATEMENTS: Review, Reflect, and Plan Ahead

Here we are just a month or so out from a new year. Fall is here and the beauty of the fall foliage will once again fill our scenery.

By now, everyone should have received your interim Giving Statement. Make sure you review the statement and let Ruth Ritenbaugh or Cheryl Creach know if you notice any errors, omissions, or issues with your statement. We are trying to make sure that if there is an error we can take care of it before year-end. Remember, Ruth and Cheryl are the only folks that can help you with any issues you may have. If you contact the Church, please leave a message without details for Ruth and Cheryl and they will contact you back.

Speaking of Ruth and Cheryl; they have decided to "retire" from being on the financial staff for St Mark's. They have given enough notice so that their replacements, Penny Dole and Carol Gering, can be trained and ready to go by January 1. Ruth and Cheryl have begun training Penny and Carol and will continue to assist them through year-end. It is with a grateful heart that we thank Ruth and Cheryl for their many years of service in this capacity, their service will be missed. However, we whole-heartedly welcome Penny and Carol to the Finance Team here at St Mark's. If the situation presents itself, please thank Ruth and Cheryl while welcoming Penny and Carol. Everyone needs to remember; these are volunteer positions and these ladies give of their own time to assist St Mark's.

St Mark's ended September, 2024, with \$51,632 in the Checking Account while we have \$62,477 in our savings account. Remember that \$39,420 of the savings can only be used for improvements to the campus of St Mark's. During the month of September, we received \$26,377 in giving while paying out \$20,928 in expenditures.

Our loan at Park National Bank stands at \$22,819 (through the end of September). It is current with all payments being made on a timely basis. We would like to let you know of some new information regarding the loan at the bank. This loan automatically renews every five years. At that point, the bank adjusts the interest rate. This automatic renewal occurred and we have been notified that our interest rate on the loan has increased from 3.875% to 6.375%. Thus, resulting in more needing to be paid for interest and less being paid against the principal. We would like to make this an initiative for the Congregation that we pay this loan off as quickly as we can to save the additional interest expense. If possible, we would like to ask those who are able to give a little extra with your giving. If you can assist us with the payoff of the loan, please note that on your giving envelope so that Ruth and Cheryl will know of your intentions with your gift.

With this being November, we want to Thank You all for the financial gifts you have given to St Mark's this year. Without your generosity, St Mark's would not be able to operate or be able to serve our community in the manner it does. We ask for your continued support through your prayers and gifts. We appreciate your time reading this article. As always, Bill and I are available for questions regarding the finances of St Mark's. Please let us know if you have any questions.









