DECEMBER MEMBER SPOTLIGHT: We Remember Richard (Dick) Davis August 14, 1929-November 16, 2024

This month, we honor the memory of Richard (Dick) Davis. Richard "Dick" Park Davis lived a life filled with love, service, and joy that touched everyone around him. Born on August 14, 1929, to Zell and Donna Davis in Newark, Oh, Dick embodied dedication and kindness from an early age. His life was a journey of



commitment—to his country, his family, and his passions.



Dick joined the Army Air Corps, serving both at home and abroad. After leaving the Air Force in 1949, fate led him to Edith, the love of his life. The couple wed in 1951 and shared a remarkable 73 years of marriage, raising three cherished daughters: Cindy,

Mary, and Laurie.

While raising their family, Dick and Edith paused their love of square dancing to focus on their children. But once the girls were grown, they returned to the dance floor with renewed enthusiasm, even teaching classes at the Hayloft in Winton Woods. Dick's dedication extended to serving as publicity chair for the National Square Dance Convention, a role he held for five years.



Following his retirement from the City of Fairfield Street Department, Dick's creativity flourished. His woodworking brought joy to many, as he crafted signs, pens, boxes, and centerpieces for family and friends. His craftsmanship reflected the care and precision he brought to every endeavor.

Travel was another shared love for Dick and Edith. Together, they explored the country, visiting family, attending square dance and barbershop conventions, or simply enjoying vacations. But perhaps Dick's greatest passion was barbershop singing. Starting in Newark, Ohio,


in 1959, and later with the Delta Kings Chorus of Cincinnati, Dick sang for over six decades. His leadership and dedication earned him six "Person of Note" awards,

including Barbershopper of the Year in 2006. Even in his later years, Dick's voice resonated with warmth, continuing to sing until just a month before his passing.



When not singing or creating, Dick found peace in his garden, where he delighted in feeding birds and squirrels. Many happy hours were spent in the sunroom or on the porch, watching their lively antics with a smile. Above all, Dick was a devoted husband, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather. His 95 years were filled with moments of laughter, music, and love, shared with his wife Edith; daughters Cindy (Bob) Nixon, Mary (Ira) Begley, and Laurie (Dan) McCoy; eight grandchildren; and 15 great -grandchildren.

Dick's life was a melody of joy and love that will continue to resonate in the hearts of all who knew him.




ONE INCREDIBLE SEASON: Celebrating the Spirit of Christmas Through Music and Joy

FINANCIAL & TRUSTEES UPDATES

A SEASON OF GIVING AND SAVING: Important Updates for Year-end and 2025

Merry Christmas, St Mark's Family! Thanksgiving is now behind us, and we now look forward to celebrating the Birth of Jesus! Always a joyous and busy time for all of us.

Just a few things to touch on before 2024 comes to an end. As more folks have been giving online, we have found that we have a large surplus of giving envelopes from previous years that were never picked up or used. So, the Finance Committee has decided to recycle those boxes of envelopes and not purchase new envelopes for 2025. The printed dates on the envelopes and the number in the right-hand corner have been marked out. Please make sure that you note your name on the envelopes when you use them on Sunday mornings. Those will be available in the Narthex for pickup starting Sunday, December 8, 2024. There is a two-fold reason for this decision is 1) it helps to use up stock we have already paid for and 2) it will be saving the Church money. If you have any questions, please let us know.

Here is the reminder on the giving of financial gifts to the Church for year-end. The last date to received anything in the mail: Saturday, December 28, 2024. The last date to gift a gift during worship: Sunday, December 29, 2024 The last date to drop off a gift outside of worship: Friday, December 27, 2024. **PLEASE NOTE**: If you intend to drop off a financial gift outside of worship, please verify that the Church Office is open.

Giving statements will be ready for mailing shortly after the start of the new year. The Church's deadline to send them is 01/31/25, so you can expect to receive yours in January.

Remember, the newsletter article is always a month behind with financial data because of the deadline to get the articles submitted. St Mark's ended October with \$55,006 in the Checking Account while \$62,477 remains in our savings account. As always, I am reminding everyone that \$39,420 of the savings can only be used for improvements to the campus of St Mark's. Please note that the apportionments are being paid and we will have that commitment taken care of on schedule by the end of the current year.

Last month, we shared that the Park National Bank loan had been reviewed and renewed, resulting in an increase in the interest rate. This means a larger portion of our payments now goes toward interest rather than the loan principal. To address this, we asked for your help through additional giving to accelerate the loan payoff. Thanks to your generosity, we've made progress, but there's still work to be done. As of the end of October, the loan balance at Park National Bank stands at \$18,018.

Just one last note of thanks for Ruth Ritenbaugh and Cheryl Creach. Both will be stepping away from the Financial Secretary positions at year-end. We will miss their service to St Mark's in these positions. Penny Dole and Carol Gering will be taking over in January.

We are looking forward to working with them. We thank Ruth and Cheryl for the time they have taken to train and prepare Penny and Carol for their new role.

Merry Christmas, Everyone, and let us pray for a healthy and safe New Year!

PREPARING OUR HEARTS: Finding Joy and Hope in the Advent Season:

The Advent Season is a time to prepare for the celebration of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. It is fascinating how different people find meaning and comfort in the Christmas story. For some, it is the journey to Bethlehem. For others, it is the newborn baby lying in the manger surrounded by animals. A favorite for many is Luke 2:10 – The angel said to them, do not be afraid! for behold, I bring you good news of great joy which will be for all the people. May we be inspired by hope and assured by faith as we begin the Advent journey.

Your Trustees and other wonderful members have been inspired to continue the good work of maintaining our church grounds, facilities, and parsonage. A productive Helping Hands Workday was held in November lead by Kristy Theiss. This was our final one for 2024. Thank you to all who faithfully show up to help on All Church Workdays. It is greatly needed, and we appreciate it. Your Trustees have met over the past few months to look at the restrooms on the first floor of the church and education wing. Beginning in early 2025 we will be making a few changes to accommodate a diverse membership and visitors to our church. The women's restroom off the sanctuary will have the addition of a changing mat on the counter for members and visitors with young children needing to have a diaper changed.

The men's restroom, closest to the Narthex will become handicap accessible and unisex. We will remove the partitions for easy access into the restroom and the space with the stool. Handrails will be added for those using a wheelchair or walker. A lock will be added indicating "in use" or "vacant" since only one person will be using it at a time. This is like the women's room by the nursery and is similar to the portable restrooms you find at events.


The women's restroom off the nursery will become a family restroom. Those using the restroom will lock the door to the hallway and the door leading to the nursery. The changing table will remain in its location in the nursery, but there will be a curtain separating it so not to disturb the children in the nursery. Once this is ready to be implemented, we will post signs on the doors to ease everyone into the transition. If you have questions, please see either of us.
