To help keep everyone informed, the Lead Team will provide updates in each issue of the newsletter. These updates will include facility matters, financial summaries, and a general overview of the team's work. FINANCE NEWS

Celebrating a Milestone and Preparing for the Future:

As of January 31, 2025, St Mark's has a balance of \$64,224.61 in the Checking Account and we have a balance of \$65,301.89 in the Savings Account. As I always point out, only \$25,881.62 of the Savings Account can be used for Operating Expenses for the Church. With \$39,420.27 being held for Improvements to the St Mark's Campus.

With the support and generosity of our entire St. Mark's family, we are thrilled to share that we paid off our loan at Park National Bank before the end of 2024!

This was truly a collective effort, made possible by the faithfulness, dedication, and generosity of our congregation. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to everyone who contributed to making this goal a reality.

Now that the loan is fully paid, we are taking a proactive step toward the future. Each month, we are setting aside the amount that was previously allocated for loan payments into our savings account. This will allow us to be better prepared for upcoming capital projects and any necessary improvements to our church facilities.

Additionally, we are pleased to share that all our expenses are current, and we continue to make regular contributions toward our apportionments. Through careful financial stewardship and the ongoing faithfulness of our congregation, we are not only maintaining our commitments but also planning for a strong and stable future.


